PRAYERS & INSTRUCTION

THE DAYS OF PENTECOST

This day, some nineteen hundred, ninety years ago, was the official promulgation of the Gospel.

Starting in Jerusalem and blessed with extraordinary success by the conversion and baptism of three thousand Jews, it extended rapidly over all the known world through the inspired preaching of the apostles. Even during their lifetime, Our Lord was adored in every nation under the sun. Thus, the prophecies were fulfilled: "*Thou shalt renew the face of the earth*"; and "*I will pour out My Spirit upon all flesh*."

These nations, who were converted, although so different in disposition and character, formed but one family, having the same faith, the same laws, the same Sacraments, the same Head. This great family, spread throughout the know world, is the Church of Jesus Christ- one, holy, Catholic and apostolic. For more than nineteen hundred

years the "*gates of hell*" have fought against it, but they have not prevailed, and never shall prevail.

As we celebrate today the anniversary of this great event, we must also seek to renew it within ourselves. In this respect, the feast of Pentecost differs from all others; for others are feasts of gratitude for past mercies, whereas in this we celebrate a mystery which is continually renewed in the Church, and which will be renewed in the souls of the faithful, even to the end of the world. On this very day we may venture, according to the promise of Jesus Christ, to ask, and to expect with the same confidence as the apostles, the descent of the Holy Ghost upon ourselves, and the communication of His virtues and gifts, because it is His will for each of us without exception.

We also celebrate that, through

the uninterrupted succession of sovereign pontiffs, bishops, and priests, as successors of St. Peter, the apostles, and the seventy-two disciples, the Gospel with all its spiritual and temporal advantages has reached us.

And lastly, on this day we render thanks for these great blessings from Almighty God. Having been blessed to this extent, however, we incur the obligation to an apostolic life, one of spreading the teachings of Christ to all we know and meet, most especially by the example of our virtuous lives. Thus stands the serious obligation to ensure that we can fulfill this duty by growing in holiness each and every day of our lives.

Therefore, today let us renew our zeal, and examine whether by our words, example, prayers, or works of penance, in short, by all the means within our power,

PENTECOST SUNDAY



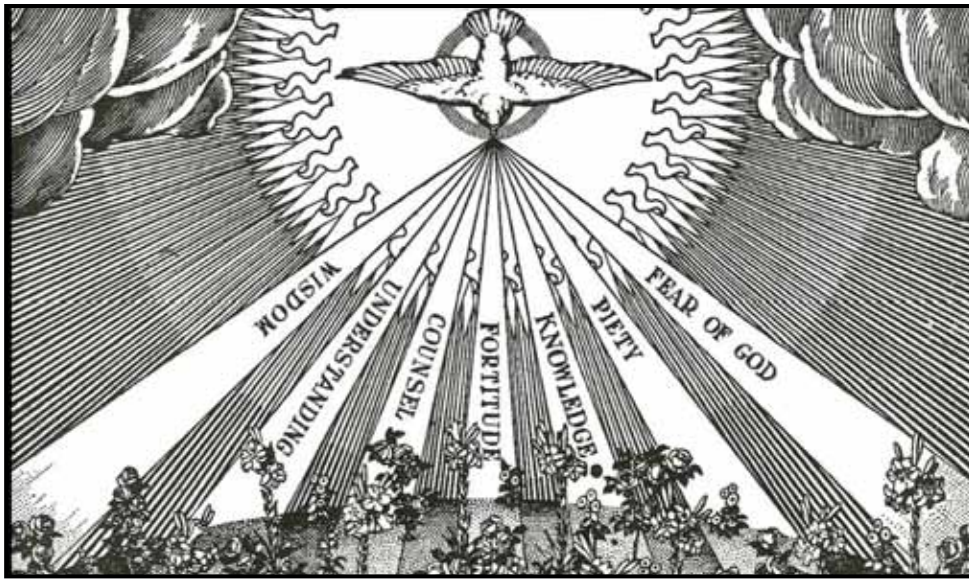
Introuit. Wis. 1, 7. The Spirit of the Lord hath filled the whole earth, alleluia; and that which containeth all things hath knowledge of the voice, alleluia, alleluia, alleluia. Ps. 67, 2. Let God arise, and His enemies be scattered; and let them that hate Him fly before His face.

Prayer. O God, Who on this day didst instruct the hearts of the faithful by the light of the Holy Spirit, grant us, by the same Spirit, to relish what is right and ever to rejoice in His consolation. Through...in the unity of the same.

Epistle. Acts 2, 1-11. When the days of Pentecost were accomplished, they were all together in one place; and suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a mighty wind coming, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them parted tongues as it were of fire, and it sat upon every one of them; and they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and they began to speak with divers tongues, according as the Holy Ghost gave them to speak. Now there were dwelling at Jerusalem, Jews, devout men out of every nation under heaven. And when this was noised abroad, the multitude came together, and were confounded in mind, because that every man heard them speak in his own tongue: and they were all amazed and wondered, saying, Behold are not all these that speak, Galileans? And how have we heard every man our own tongue wherein we were born? Parthians, and Medes, and Elamites, and inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Lybia about Cyrene, and strangers of Rome, Jews also, and proselytes, Cretes and Arabians: we have heard them speak in our own tongues the wonderful works of God.

Alleluia. Alleluia. V. Ps. 103, 30. Send forth Thy Spirit, and they shall be created: and Thou shalt renew the face of the earth. Alleluia. V. (*here all kneel*) Come, O Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Thy faithful: and kindle in them the fire of Thy love.

Sequences. Holy Spirit! Lord of light! From thy clear celestial height, Thy pure, beaming radiance give: Come, Thou, Father of the poor! Come, with treasures which endure! Come, Thou light of all that live! Thou of all counselors best, Visiting the troubled breast, Dost refreshing peace bestow: Thou in toil art comfort sweet; Pleasant coolness in the heat; Solace in the midst of woe. Light immortal! Light divine! Visit Thou these hearts of Thine, And our inmost being fill. If Thou take Thy grace away, Noth-



ing pure in man will stay; All his good is turn'd to ill. Heal our wounds--our strength renew; On our dryness pour Thy dew; Wash the stains of guilt away; Bend the stubborn heart and will; Melt the frozen, warm the chill; Guide the steps that go astray. Thou, on those who evermore Thee confess and Thee adore, In Thy sevenfold gifts

descend. Give them comfort when they die; Give them life with Thee on high; Give them joys which never end. Amen. Alleluia.

Gospel. John 14, 23-31. At that time, Jesus said to His disciples, If any one love Me, he will keep My word, and My Father will love him, and we will come to him, and will make our abode with him. He that loveth Me not, keepeth not My words: and the word which you have heard is not Mine, but the Father's Who sent Me. These things have I spoken to you, abiding with you: but the Paraclete, the Holy Ghost, Whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring all things to your mind, whatsoever I shall have said to you. Peace I leave with you, My peace I give unto you; not as the world giveth, do I give unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, nor let it be afraid. You have heard that I said to you, I go away, and I come unto you. If you loved Me, you would indeed be glad, because I go to the Father, for the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you before it come to pass, that, when it shall come to pass, you may believe. I will not now speak many things with you; for the prince of this world cometh, and in Me he hath not anything. But that the world may know that I love the Father, and as the Father hath given Me commandments, so do I.
