SHORT SERIES ON THE GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT: FEAR OF THE LORD & WISDOM

FEAR OF THE LORD

You may remember that we spoke about this Gift of Fear of the Lord as perfecting the virtue of temperance. It turns out that this Gift also perfects the theological virtue of hope. Since much has already been said about fear earlier in this series, today's write-up will make more precise the role of this Gift in perfecting the virtue of hope.

The Gift of Fear purifies in us our reasons for supernatural hope by removing all of the little attachments to created things. It serves also as a counterweight to any presumption into which we way fall when we take aspects of our salvation lightly. The Passive Night of the Spirit experienced by Saint John of the Cross could be explained by the action of this Gift.

Moreover, this Gift purifies how we consider God. Everything that reduces the purity of our spiritual outlook will be eliminated. It brings us to appreciate the infinite distance that is between God, Who beatifies us, and the false beatitudes that we imagine we find among created things. True purity is not to become indifferent to the Divine, but to recognize what is a gift of God, and how it is not God, but a means to God. By the Gift of Fear, we learn to yearn always for God no matter what gifts we receive from Him. The purification that we receive brings us to want God and God alone. It allows us to recognize that we cannot possess God unless we are truly His as our only goal and final end, as our All.

By purifying the theological virtue of hope so that we strive always for God, the Gift of Hope, allows us to act in a suprahuman manner. In this way, the Gift of Hope us a support or an aid for all our theological activity, supporting our attitude of filial fear so that all our moral life, especially those acts of temperance, will be raised to a higher plane of action.

WISDOM

Aristotle says in his Metaphysics, that wisdom is the means by which we seek the highest cause of things. By means of the highest cause, we can form certain judgements about the proper order of things in the universe. By this we can understand the chain of interactions between them. There are two ways to know the highest cause. The first is to become an expert in a certain field of knowledge. Such a person is capable of understanding the order of things in their area of expertise, whether architecture, law, engineering, or medicine. The other way is to know the cause that is the highest of them all, and this is God. One who has true knowledge of God, will be able to set in order all things according to His rules.

Saint Thomas justifies this by reminding us of the Apostle of the Gentiles. Saint Paul tells us, "the spiritual man judgeth all things" (1 Cor. 2:15) since as he says earlier in the same Epistle, "the Spirit searcheth all things, yea the deep things of God" (1 Cor. 2:10). This Wisdom is a Gift of the Holy Spirit by which we can come to this deep knowledge of God and set in order all things. This Gift obtained from above is different from the virtue of faith received at Baptism since the Gift of Wisdom presupposes the theological virtue of faith. By faith we assent to the Divine Truth. By the Gift of Wisdom we make judgements of things (not people!) according to Divine Truth (to which we have assented).

The Gift of Wisdom gives us something that Saint Thomas calls connaturality with Divine Truth. It resides in the will perfecting the theological virtue of charity allowing us to push our intellects to make correct judgements about things pertaining to the sacred and divine. In the history of the Church, the effects of this Gift has been noted so many times when sometimes unlettered Saints (eg.: Saint Catherine of Siena) could make statements on Sacred Doctrine that would astound the most learned. The Gift of Wisdom allows us not only to contemplate the Divine Truths, but also to judge our human acts as to their conformance with these Truths. Since charity is incompatible with mortal sin, when we are in a state of sin, we lose not only sanctifying grace, and the virtue of charity, but also the Gift of Wisdom.
