### FROM THE DESK OF THE RECTOR

Very dear faithful, today, the last Sunday before Advent, Our Lord gives us a warning in the Gospel about the end times and the persecution that is to come. Holy Scripture tells us a lot about the figure of the Antichrist. The Fathers of the Church and various commentators over the course of the centuries have much to teach us about this terrible person.

Reading them, we have some idea of his origins, growth, and the position he will take when these times of trials and persecutions begin. Our Lord has told us that we will know these things by the many signs that will take place. Many have already occurred, many are yet to take place. We certainly will recognize some of them in our present time. Many will follow him, sadly, some of the strongest of Christians among us. This is not surprising because the persecutions are expected to be terrible.

However, Our Lord tells us in the Gospel passage, that this time of persecution will be limited for the sake of the elect: those who remain faithful and do not fail to pray.

## PREPARATORY NOVENA FOR THE FEAST OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

Prepare for the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, Patroness of our country, with this novena. Each weekday will devotion will include a decade of the Rosary, a themed homily along with devotions before the Blessed Sacrament (except on the weekend).

### THEME: THE APPARITIONS OF OUR LADY

**Friday, November 29, 7:00 PM:** Rosary decade, Homily: *Our Lady of Pilar*, Devotions before the Blessed Sacrament.

**Saturday, November 30, Low Mass at 9:00 AM:** Rosary decade, Homily at Mass: *Our Lady of Good Success*, Devotions before the Blessed Sacrament.

**Sunday, December 1:** Homily at all Masses: *Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal*. Low Masses at 7:30 AM, 9:00 AM, High Mass at 11:00 AM.

**Monday, December 2, 7:00 PM:** Rosary, Homily: *Our Lady of La Salette*, Devotions before the Blessed Sacrament.

**Tuesday, December 3, 7:00 PM:** Rosary, Homily: *Our Lady of Walsingham*, Devotions before the Blessed Sacrament.

**Wednesday, December 4, 7:00 PM:** Rosary, Homily: *Our Lady of Lourdes*, Devotions before the Blessed Sacrament.

## MASS INTENTIONS FOR 2025

If you wish to request any Masses for the next calendar year, please pay careful attention to these guidelines, which are intended to promote the common good and to facilitate the very complicated work of scheduling the requests from many parishioners sometimes for the same date. The pastor is morally bound to see to it that all our parishioners have the same opportunity to have Masses offered for their loved ones and personal intentions, which is the reason for the directives explained below. Thank you for your cooperation in abiding by these norms.

- **Beginning on Monday, November 4, Mass intentions will be accepted for 2025.** No intentions will be accepted before that date (no exceptions).
- Please make sure only to use the **envelopes which will be available in church beginning Sunday, November 3** in order to fill out your Mass requests. If you have several Masses to request, please feel free to put them all in the same envelop with one check and a slip of paper listing all intentions and your desired dates.
- In the first round of scheduling, there is a strict limit of 10 (ten) Mass intentions per household to ensure that all have an opportunity to have Masses said for their intentions. If a greater number is submitted, all the requested intentions will be returned. After the new year, there will be an announcement in the bulletin if there are any remaining available spots for 2025.
- You may request specific dates, which will be accommodated to the extent possible, but no promise is made about dates. It is not possible to reserve multiple Sundays. Each household may request only one Sunday.
- A minimum stipend of \$10 is suggested per Mass. No Mass will be scheduled until the written request and accompanying Mass offering are received in the office. These may be submitted in the collection basket, by mail, or by coming in person to the sacristy. *Financial difficulties should not stop you from requesting Masses. In this case, enclose any offering as you are able.*
- For the time being, it is not possible to request a Mass by phone or e-mail.
