# GREAT NEWS

## *Holy Family House - Update*

Dear Faithful,

On this Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord which is the culminating moment of Epiphanytide, I update you with good news regarding the century-old St. Clara Parish school building, which is located at 6423 South Woodlawn, just a few feet from the Institute's US Headquarters priory building.

On Sunday, December 6, I explained to you that the Institute was in negotiations with the Southside Center of Hope to purchase the building for the benefit of the Institute's Chicago apostolate. Although the initial closing date of December 28 was missed due to the legal paperwork and process over the holidays, I am very glad and grateful to report that the closing has finally happened today. Thus, the building is now officially the property of the Institute. The entire campus of the original parish is now owned by the Institute.

The Institute is very thankful to Sister Therese O'Sullivan, IBVM, Co-Foundress of the Southside Center of Hope, for her continual friendship and ongoing support, to the Board members of the Center for their approval of the acquisition, as well as to Ms. Yaisa Hagood, the Center's current Executive Director, for her helpful collaboration.

The Institute offers sincere appreciation to His Excellency, Bishop Joseph Perry, and to the Archdiocese of Chicago for their invaluable assistance without which this acquisition would not be possible. Bishop Perry has graciously agreed to come and bless the building within the next few days.

Our spiritual family is deeply grateful to Divine Providence, whose benevolence has given us this historic building as a very promising and spacious home for our Chicago apostolate's programs and activities. This purchase has been funded by a significant donation from an anonymous local benefactor given for this specific purpose, as well as for the tremendous collective generosity of you, dear faithful, over the past year. To one and all, the Institute is very grateful! Additional thanks are due to the many people who have already volunteered to assist with the great amount of interior work which the building will need to prepare the larger temporary chapel space, the new Shrine offices for our local Chicago apostolate, as well as the social gathering and classroom areas. More volunteers are always appreciated. Many hands make light work!

I have entrusted these projects into the very capable hands of our Shrine Vice-Rector, Canon Commins, who will be coordinating the volunteers and managing the work. By the grace and help of our Infant King, our Shrine family is already rising to the occasion of this new endeavor which will bring so many fruitful benefits to us and our children. With your many helping hands and those of local friends, we will surely make this new home a place where the Reign of Christ our Infant King will touch more minds, hearts, and souls in our city and region.

It seems appropriate that we give a specific name to the building in order to reflect our particular mission and apostolate. Given the Shrine's special devotion to Christ the Infant King, to Our Lady, and to St. Joseph, we have decided to call it "Holy Family House," a name which is fittingly expressed by the historic statues of the Blessed Virgin and the Christ Child on the building's façade.

Indebted to you for your prayers, helping hands, and generous contributions, I invite you to join me in joyful thanksgiving to God as together we begin this exciting new chapter in the life of our local apostolate, and I remain,
