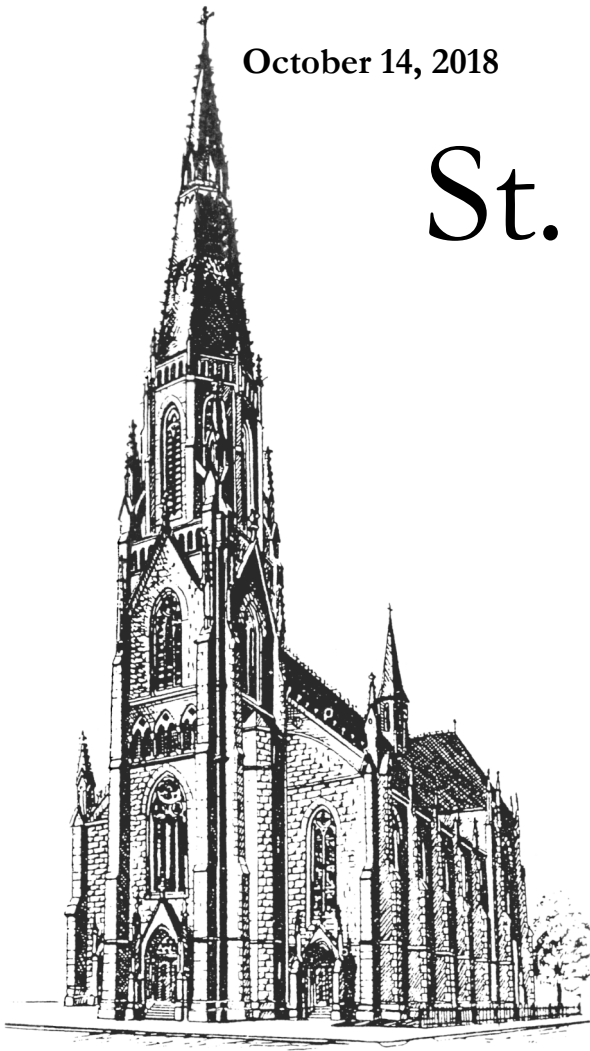

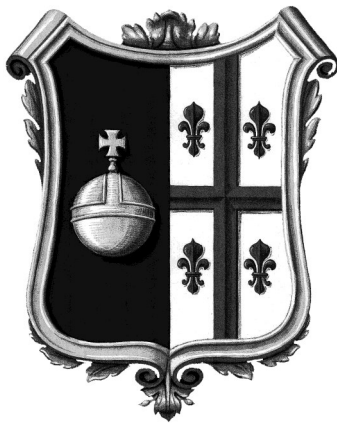

Did you know?

Yesterday, October 13th was the 101st Anniversary of the Miracle of the Sun at Fatima. Listen to how even the most secular paper in Portugal, *O Dia*, described it: *The silver sun was seen to whirl and turn in the circle of broken clouds. A cry went up from every mouth and the people fell on their knees on the muddy ground. The light turned a beautiful blue as if it had come through the stained-glass windows of a cathedral and spread itself over the people who knelt with outstretched hands. The blue faded slowly and then the light seemed to pass through yellow glass. People wept and prayed with uncovered heads in the presence of the miracle they had awaited. The seconds seemed like hours, so vivid were they.*
