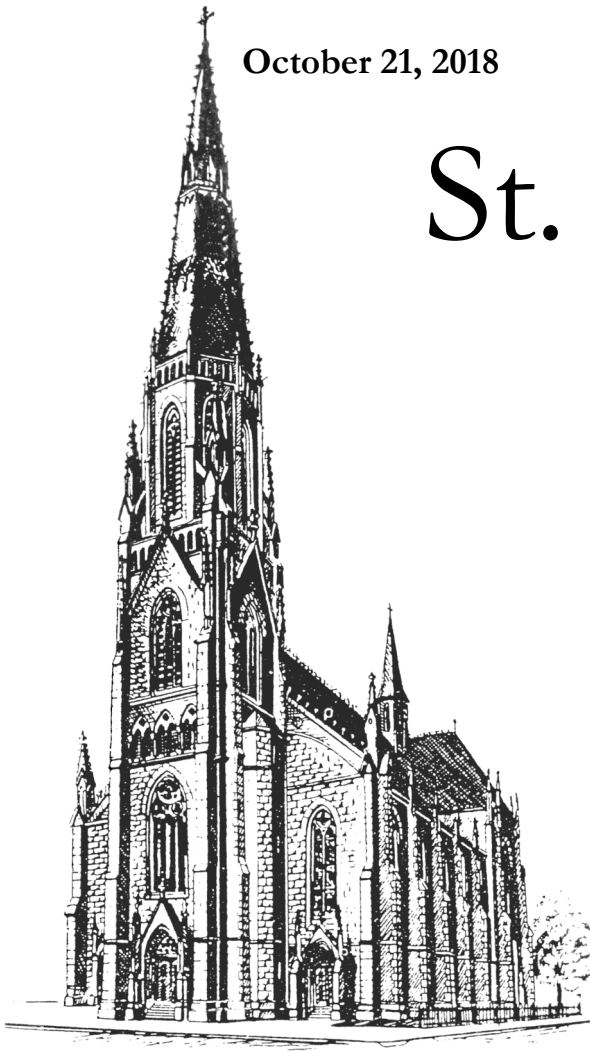

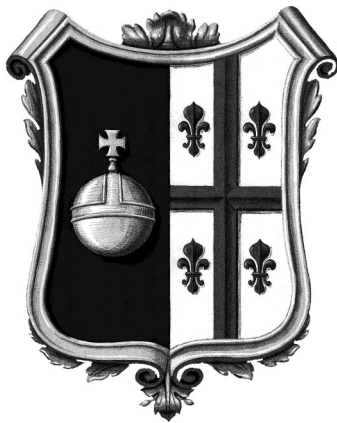

... that the Sacrament of Confirmation is the analog in the spiritual life of normal bodily growth in our natural lives, by which we reach physical and mental maturity. In the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Holy Ghost is given to strengthen us to help us to attain this spiritual maturity. He brings with Himself sanctifying grace, the *infused* moral virtues of fortitude, temperance, justice and prudence; the theological virtues of faith, hope and charity; and the seven spiritual gifts of wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. The seven gifts help us to respond promptly and suitably to His inspirations.
