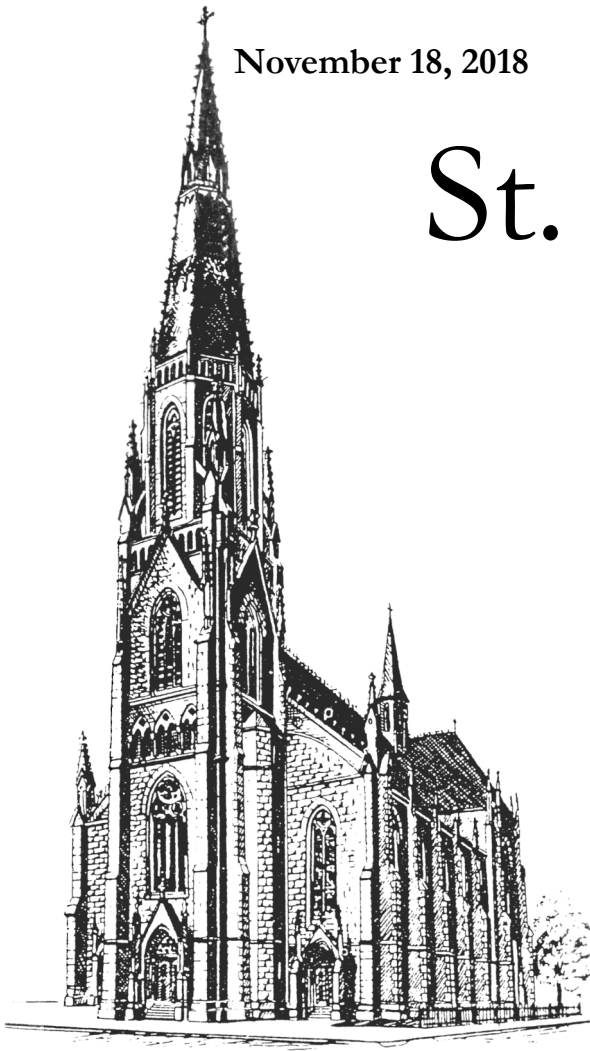

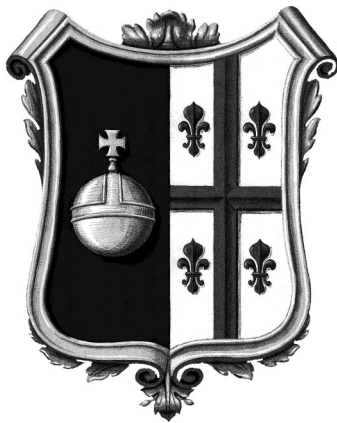

Did you know?

... that this past Friday, November 16, we celebrated the 145th Anniversary of the Consecration of our church building. This day in 1873 was a Sunday when at 9:00 AM, two divisions of a procession made their way to the Cathedral in Detroit (what is now St. Peter and Paul Jesuit) where Bishop Caspar Henry Borgess (the second bishop of Detroit) and clergy were received, and then the march continued up Jefferson to Russell to Gratiot to Orleans, arriving at Saint Joseph.

Bishops from Cleveland, Fort Wayne, and London, Ontario were also present, along with 24 societies of German, French, Polish, and Irish nationalities from parishes in Detroit. The music for the Solemn Consecration included a Mass by Haydn presented by the St. Cecelia

Choir of the church and the Detroit Opera House orchestra. That week, the *Detroit Free Press* stated that the pastor "Father Friedland is to be congratulated upon the successful issue of his labors in bringing it to completion."

Altar Boy Day!

On Saturday, December 1, after the monthly morning of Recollection, **all Altar Boys are asked to be at the Oratory by 12 noon** for a *short conference*, a *practice*, and *to be fitted in their new blue cassocks*. The blessing of the new cassocks will take place before both Masses on Saturday, December 8, Feast of the Immaculate Conception, Patronal Feast of the Institute.
