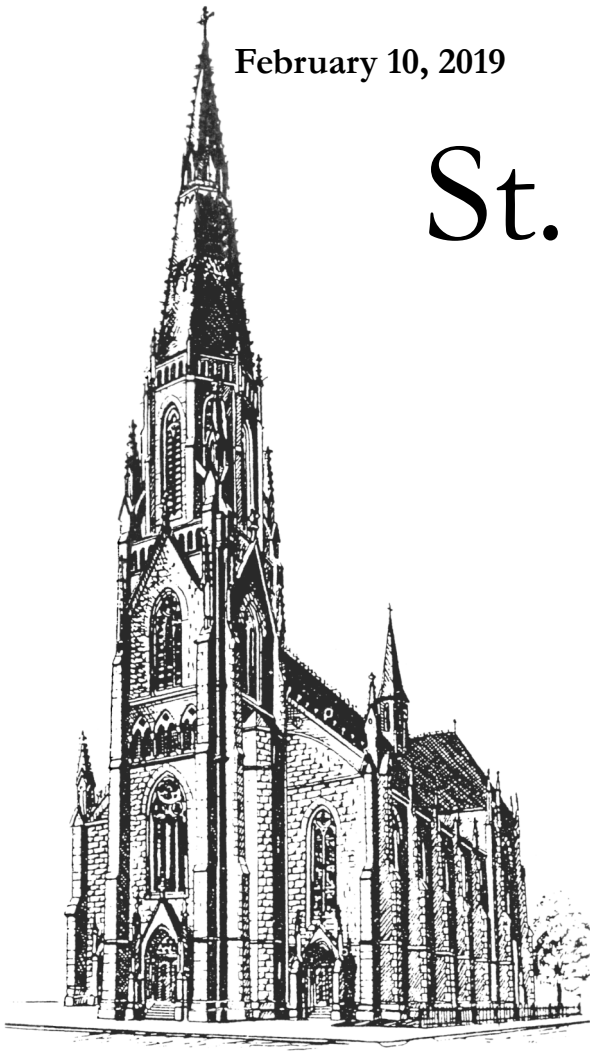

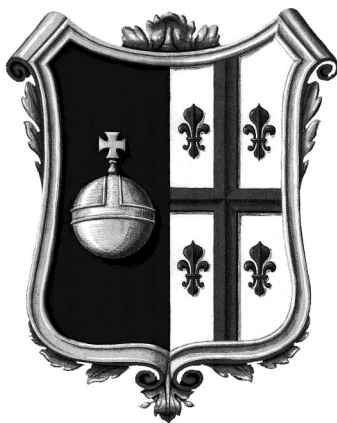

DID YOU KNOW?

... that Saint Valentine was a priest of Rome. While under house arrest of Judge Asterius, and discussing his faith with him, Valentinus was discussing the validity of Jesus. The judge put Valentinus to a test under which Valentinus succeeded in restoring the vision of Asterius' daughter. Immediately humbled and having promised to do whatever he was asked, he broke all the idols in his house, fasted for three days, and then asked for the Christian sacrament of baptism not only for himself, but also for all forty-four members of his household. Subsequently, he freed all the Christian inmates under his authority. Valentinus was later arrested again for continuing to evangelize and was sent to the emperor Claudius II himself, who took a liking to him until Valentinus tried to convince him to embrace Christianity, whereupon the emperor refused and condemned Valentinus to death, commanding that he either renounce his faith or be beaten with clubs, and beheaded. Valentinus refused and was executed outside the Flaminian Gate February 14, 269. The Father of English Literature, Geoffrey Chaucer, is to be credited with creating the association of Saint Valentine with romantic love.
