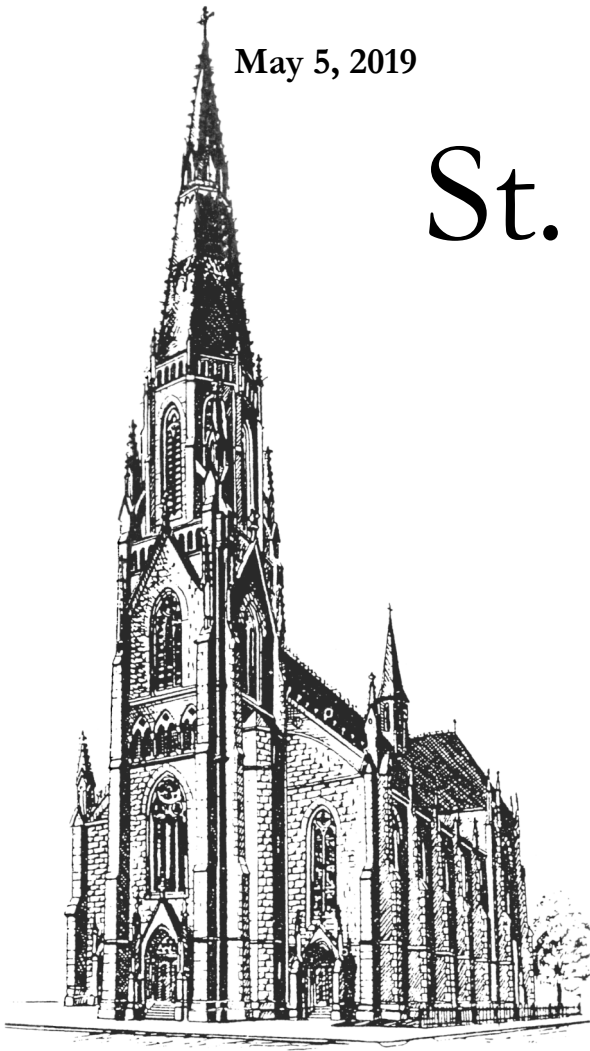

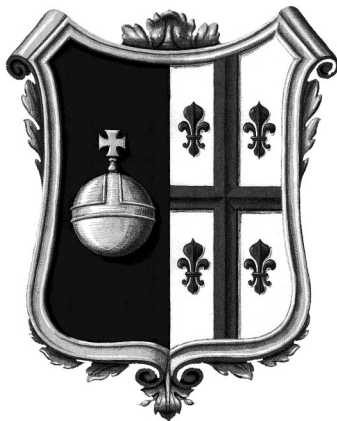

Did you know?

... that in the year 490, when a nobleman of Siponto lost the best bull in his herd, he went searching for him and found the bull kneeling in a deserted and inaccessible cave. So to put the animal out of its misery, he shot an arrow at it, which, to his amazement, turned around and struck him instead! Stunned by this apparently supernatural event, the man went to see the local bishop for advice, who ordered 3 days of prayer and fasting. Saint Michael appeared to the Bishop twice; however, he remained doubtful even when a city in his diocese was saved from annihilation by an intervention of Saint Michael. Through an appeal to the Pope, the Bishop went to the cave for three days of prayer and fasting, and on the third day, Saint Michael appearing to him saying that in the cave, the sins of men may be pardoned and what is asked there in prayer will be granted. He also told the Bishop that it was not necessary for him to consecrate the cave since he, Saint Michael, had already done so. Today, a large Basilica welcomes pilgrims at *Monte Sant'Angelo* which is close to Padre Pio's monastery of *San Giovanni Rotondo*. The Feast day of the Apparitions is May 8.
