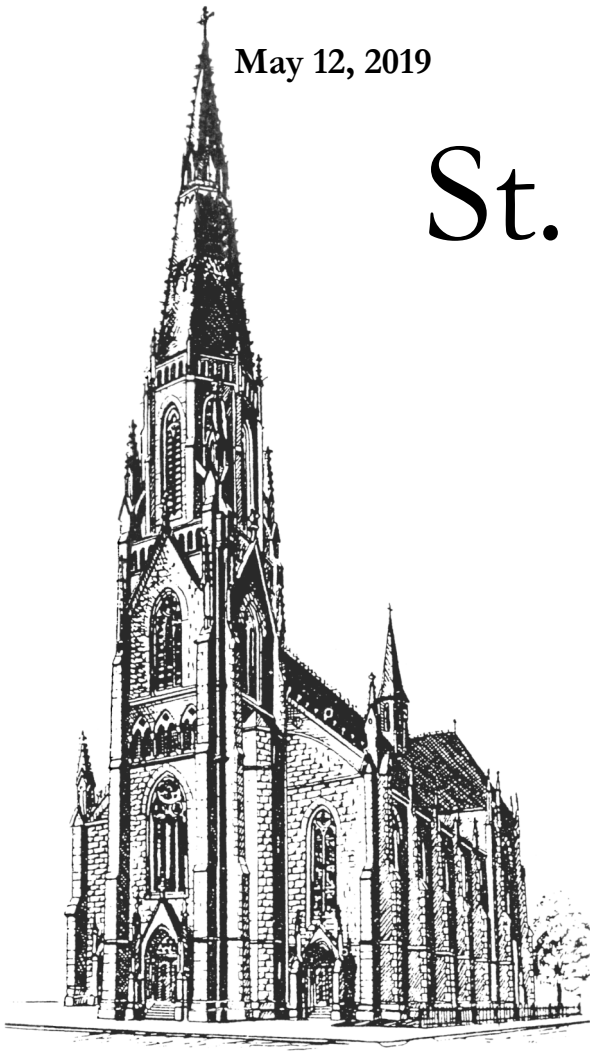

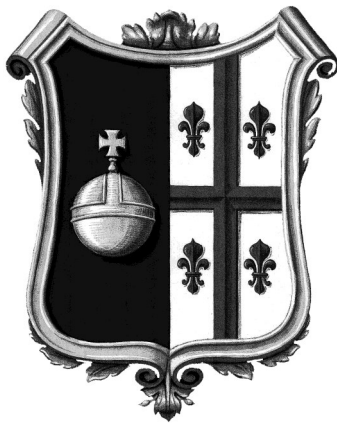

Did you know?

... that Saint John of Nepomuk whose feast day is May 16, is the first martyr of the Seal of the Confessional, a patron against calumnies and, because of the manner of his death, a protector from floods and drowning. He was a confessor to the Queen of Bohemia (Czech Republic) who had to endure a difficult marriage to the King, a capricious and changeable man given to jealous fits of rage. The Queen was greatly persecuted by the poor treatment she received from her spouse. But God gave her a comforter and guide in Saint John, by whose counsels she was able to bear the burdens of her life. She learned to suffer her afflictions with joy. The King, jealous, sought to learn the secrets of her confessions from Saint John, who would not reveal anything, even after being tortured twice by orders of the King. Threatened with death a third time, he refused once again and was ordered drowned in the Vltava river on May 16, 1383. Saint John Nepomuk's body was recovered from the river and in defiance of the orders of the King was buried in the Cathedral of Prague.
