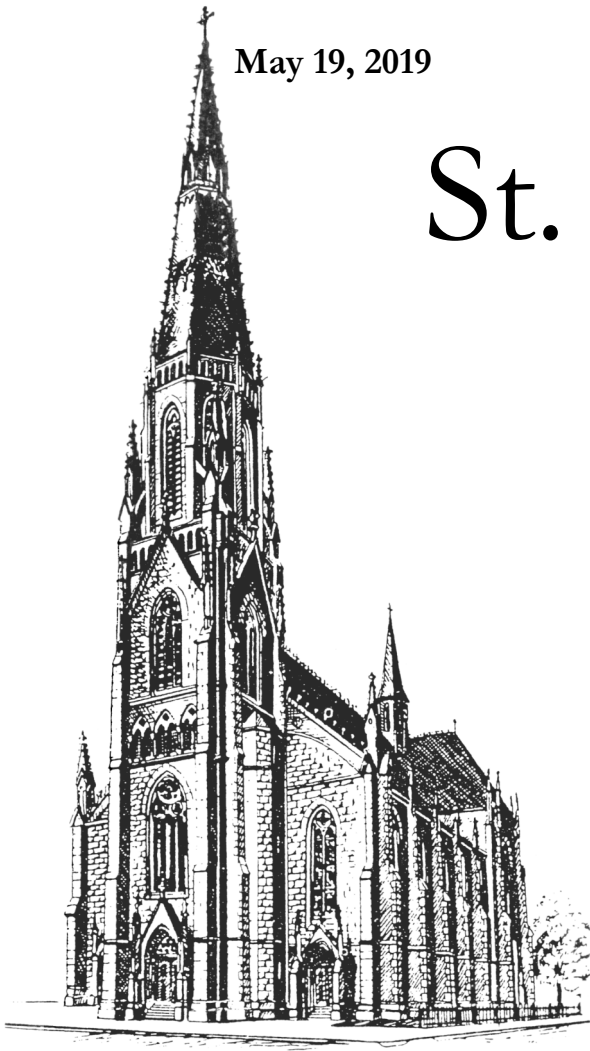

Did you know?

... that Pope Saint Gregory VII (~1020 - 1085) is one of the greatest of Roman Pontiffs and one of the most remarkable men of all times. He was of humble origin and was educated in a Cluniac monastery in Rome on the Aventine Hill. He was a chaplain to Pope Gregory VI and an administrator under Pope Leo IX and their successors. With each mission assigned to him, he acquitted himself with much skill and success. He understood his mission to be that of an assistant to the Popes and refused all attempts at election. However, during the funeral of Pope Alexander II, his protestations proved fruitless and by popular acclaim, the Cardinals voted for him in the next conclave in 1073. He was clearly the man of the hour, and he commanded respect by his austere virtue, and his genius administration. He immediately set about attacking the two most prevalent evils in the Church: simony, the sale of spiritual things; and clerical indiscipline, both in word and deed. At a time when the papacy was a laughing stock all over Europe, Pope Gregory VII brought it back to a state of respectability.
