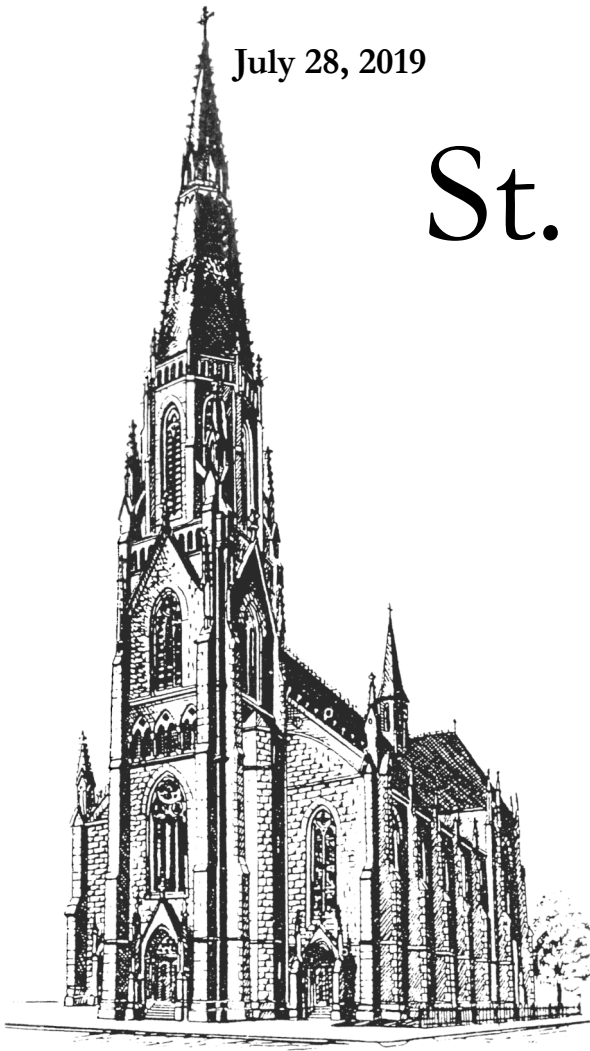

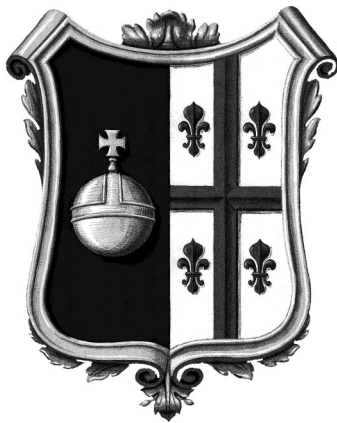

Did you know?

... that Saint Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Jesuits, whose feast day we celebrate on July 31, was a worldly but gallant soldier when wounded in a battle and forced to lie in bed while his legs healed. During this time, while reading the lives of the saints, he came upon the principle for his now famous Spiritual Exercises: thoughts from God filled the soul with consolation, peace, and tranquility; whereas the others bring some sensible delight, but leave a certain bitterness and heaviness in the heart. This is the fundamental rule for the discernment of the Spirit of God, and the world in all the motions of the soul. After an attack of fear and scrupulosity while at a monastery in Manresa: finding no comfort in prayer, no relief in fasting, no remedy in disciplines, no consolation from the sacraments, his soul was overwhelmed with bitter sadness, apprehending some sin in every step he took, and often on the very brink of despair, an act of obedience to his confessor was the occasion for a return of tranquility of mind, and spiritual joy in his soul. From this experience he acquired a particular talent for curing scrupulous consciences, and a singular light to discern them.. From there on, wherever Divine Providence sent him, we was always ready and willing.
