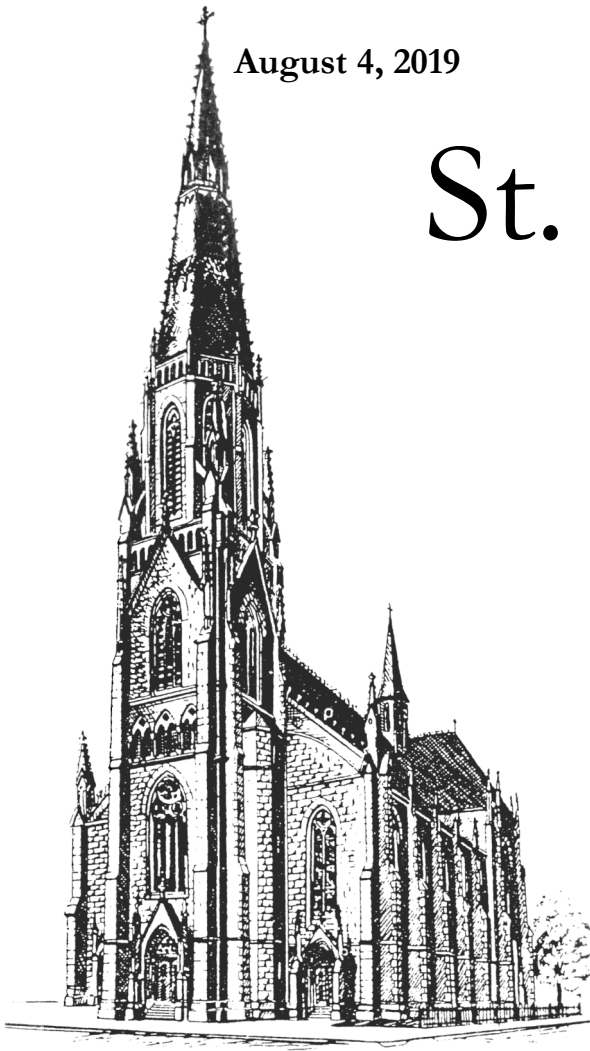

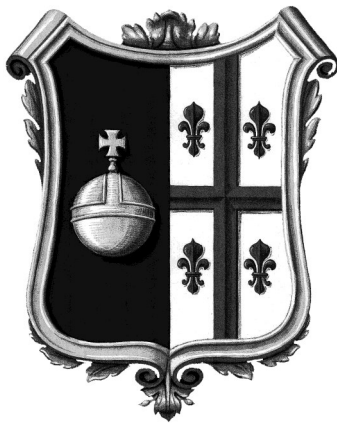

**Did you know?**

... that in Saint Lawrence (August 10) we have a sensible demonstration of how powerful is the grace of Jesus Christ, which is able to sweeten whatever is bitter and harsh to us. If we had the resolution and fervor of the saints in the practice of devotion, we would find all difficulties, which discourage us, to be mere shadows and phantoms. A lively faith, like that of the martyrs, would allow us to condemn the honors and pleasures of the world, and judge the goods and evils of this life, not by nature, but by the light and principles of faith only. If we sincerely love God, as they did, we would embrace His Holy Will with joy in all things, and have no other desire, and find no happiness except in it. If we are dejected or impatient under troubles, indulge in murmurs and complaints, or call ourselves unhappy in them, it is evident that inordinate self-love reigns in our hearts, and that we seek our own inclinations more than the Will of God. The state of suffering is the true test of our love, by which we may judge whether in duties that are agreeable we love the Will of God, or only our own will. If self-love uncovers itself in our sufferings, all the rest of our lives is to be suspected of the same disorder; and we cannot say that faith and divine love are the principles of our actions.
