## ABOUT ST. JOSEPH SHRINE

A magnificent Victorian Gothic edifice completed in 1873 and noted as of national architectural significance, St. Joseph Shrine is a landmark center of Catholic Faith, culture, and community in Detroit's historic Eastern Market district. Since October 2016, the Canons of the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest have served and led the local faithful by bringing daily Masses, regular devotions, liturgical instruction, and an active parish life. As a result, the parish community at St. Joseph Shrine continues to grow, enriching both young and old, individuals and families from all backgrounds and neighborhoods.

In July 2013, St. Joseph was merged with two nearby parishes. Then in October 2016, St. Joseph became its own parish under the spiritual and pastoral care of the Institute of Christ the King. **In March 2020, the Parish was granted the designation of Archdiocesan Shrine** in recognition of its vibrant spiritual growth and daily life.

## Take note

## WHAT IS A CANON?

A Canon is a most curious creature in the ecclesial world. He is neither exactly a diocesan priest nor precisely a monk. Rather, he falls in between the two.

A monk, you see, dedicates his life to the praise and worship of God by singing the hours of the Divine Office in common with his confrères in the community chapel. Calling this the Work of God, or Opus Dei, by the offering of his life he ensures that God is praised from the rising of the sun to its setting all over the world - both in space and in time. Starting early in the morning, the monk begins with the prayer of *Matins*, followed by *Lauds* at the rising of the sun, the office of *Prime*, *Tierce* by mid-morning, *Sext* at mid-day, *None* at the middle of the afternoon, *Vespers* in the evening, and finally *Compline* at night to end the day. In this way, God is praised all through the day, everyday of the year. The rest of the hours in his day are divided up between the work of the community and time for study.

A diocesan priest, also called a secular priest, sings none of the hours of the office in community, or rarely. Rather, he says them all in private so that he can give attention to his pastoral duties.

A Canon, on the other hand, is between the two. He sings some of the hours of the Divine Office in community, and the rest of them in private. The Canons of the Institute sing the hours of *Lauds*, *Sext*, *Vespers*, and if possible, *Compline*. This way, the community of Canons bring an aspect of monastic life into the parish where they work, while at the same time being dedicated to their pastoral duties.

But there is more. In Europe in particular where the notion of the canonical life originated, a Cathedral had a Chapter of Canons whose role was to be the model of how the liturgy was to be celebrated in the whole Diocese. Living under the Bishop, they took particular care with the celebration of the Liturgy while at the same time helping him with the tasks of administration of the Diocese. This notion of the Liturgy celebrated by the Canons as being the model for the way the Liturgy was to be celebrated in the diocese came from their title, Canon, which comes from κανόν (kanon) in Greek which means "rule or measure", in short the standard against which everything else is to be measured. In much the same way, the Canons of the Institute have the mission in any diocese of celebrating the Liturgy in the way that it should be done for the Glory of God.
