ABOUT ST. JOSEPH SHRINE

A magnificent Victorian Gothic edifice completed in 1873 and noted as of national architectural significance, St. Joseph Shrine is a landmark center of Catholic Faith, culture, and community in Detroit's historic Eastern Market district. Since October 2016, the Canons of the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest have served and led the local faithful by bringing daily Masses, regular devotions, liturgical instruction, and an active parish life. As a result, the parish community at St. Joseph Shrine continues to grow, enriching both young and old, individuals and families from all backgrounds and neighborhoods.

In July 2013, St. Joseph was merged with two nearby parishes. Then in October 2016, St. Joseph became its own parish under the spiritual and pastoral care of the Institute of Christ the King. **In March 2020, the Parish was granted the designation of Archdiocesan Shrine** in recognition of its vibrant spiritual growth and daily life.

MORE ABOUT THE INSTITUTE OF CHRIST THE KING

The Institute uses as its motto on its coat of arms the scriptural verse taken from Saint Paul's letter to the Ephesians 4:15: "Veritatem facientes in Caritate - Living the truth in charity." In the service of Christ the King, the Institute is entirely given to working for the establishment of His reign over the hearts of all.

In the coat of arms, on the left side, the globe (*orbis*) surmounted with a cross represents the universal royalty of Christ. The blue background symbolizes the Immaculate Conception, principal patroness of the Institute, to whom all the members are consecrated. On the right half, is a cross in red with the *fleur-de-lys* (lily) of the city of Florence. The lily, a symbol of the virtue of purity, is another sign of this patronage of Our Lady under Her title of the Immaculate Conception. The Florentine lily signifies the proximity of the Seminary to the city of Florence of which the lily is a symbol.



Whether it is saying Mass, praying for our flock, administering our Parishes, teaching catechism, we Canons, Oblates and Sisters of the Institute seek to live out the truths of our Faith everyday. Our daily life provides ample occasions for growth through mortifications that we accept under the guidance of our secondary patrons Saint Francis de Sales, Saint Thomas Aquinas, Saint Benedict, and Saint Thérèse de Lisieux. Each of them exerts their patronage over a different aspect of our lives - Saint Francis de Sales for our spirituality, Saint Thomas Aquinas for our intellectual formation, Saint Benedict for the liturgy, and Saint Thérèse de Lisieux for our Missions.

Being childless for a long time, she conceived Our Lady after much prayer, and therefore is also the patroness of childless people, grandparents, mothers, and pregnancy.

St. Joseph Shrine Sacrament Information:

Infant Baptism: Parents requesting Baptism must be active registered members of the Shrine.

First Communion and Confirmation: Children must attend the sacramental catechism classes at the Shrine.

Holy Matrimony: Couples planning to marry at the Shrine must call the Rectory for the proper instructions.

Anointing of the Sick: Members facing surgery, serious illness, or even death may call (313) 784-9152. *Never wait, never hesitate... remember: physical healing can also be an effect of the sacrament. Don't deprive a loved one of God's help.*
