ABOUT ST. JOSEPH SHRINE

A magnificent Victorian Gothic edifice completed in 1873 and noted as of national architectural significance, St. Joseph Shrine is a landmark center of Catholic Faith, culture, and community in Detroit's historic Eastern Market district. Since October 2016, the Canons of the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest have served and led the local faithful by bringing daily Masses, regular devotions, liturgical instruction, and an active parish life. As a result, the parish community at St. Joseph Shrine continues to grow, enriching both young and old, individuals and families from all backgrounds and neighborhoods.

In July 2013, St. Joseph was merged with two nearby parishes. Then in October 2016, St. Joseph became its own parish under the spiritual and pastoral care of the Institute of Christ the King. **In March 2020, the Parish was granted the designation of Archdiocesan Shrine** in recognition of its vibrant spiritual growth and daily life.

DID YOU KNOW?

... that the Basilica of Saint Mary Major also has within it the crib in which Our Lord was laid after His birth, and an icon of Our Lady under her title of *Salus Populi Romani* a title given to her after she saved the Romans from a plague. This magnificent edifice was built after the Council at Ephesus in 431 at which Our Lady was proclaimed the Mother of God.

THE CHOIR HABIT OF THE INSTITUTE

The Institute has a strong identity founded on the spirituality of its Holy Patrons and on the canonical form of life. In 1994, the Institute was placed under the patronage of the Immaculate Conception. Three saints have been chosen as patrons: St. Benedict, St. Thomas Aquinas, and most importantly, St. Francis de Sales.

Traditionally, priests living in a community, assigned to a church and ordained for the celebration of the celebration of the solemn Latin liturgy, without having taken religious vows, have been called canons. They were distinguished by a choir habit proper to their community.

In 2006, Cardinal Antonelli, Archbishop of Florence, conferred to the priests and oblates of the Institute their distinctive choir habits for the first time. The choir habit consists of a rochet, a manteletta with the cross of Saint Francis de Sales affixed to a cord that is blue and white, as well as a biretta surmounted with a blue pom-pom. The Superiors and members of the General Council of the Institute have a blue manteletta, the other canons a black one (white for the missionaries) with blue piping. The oblates have the cross of Saint Francis de Sales above their surplice. The blue color symbolizes the particular devotion of the Institute to the Immaculate Conception. It also resembles the violet color worn at the time of Saint Francis de Sales, as we can note on the paintings of that era showing the Holy Bishop.

The choir habit shows the strong spiritual unity and proper identity of the Institute. It also adds a greater solemnity to the liturgy.
