## ABOUT ST. JOSEPH SHRINE

A magnificent Victorian Gothic edifice completed in 1873 and noted as of national architectural significance, St. Joseph Shrine is a landmark center of Catholic Faith, culture, and community in Detroit's historic Eastern Market district. Since October 2016, the Canons of the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest have served and led the local faithful by bringing daily Masses, regular devotions, liturgical instruction, and an active parish life. As a result, the parish community at St. Joseph Shrine continues to grow, enriching both young and old, individuals and families from all backgrounds and neighborhoods.

In July 2013, St. Joseph was merged with two nearby parishes. Then in October 2016, St. Joseph became its own parish under the spiritual and pastoral care of the Institute of Christ the King. **In March 2020, the Parish was granted the designation of Archdiocesan Shrine** in recognition of its vibrant spiritual growth and daily life.

#### **ABOUT THE INSTITUTE - SAINT FRANCIS DE SALES**

Saint Francis de Sales was born on August 21, 1567 at the Chateau de Sales in Savoy, today in France, and at that time an independent dukedom at the western border of Switzerland. At the age of twelve, he declared that he wanted to be a priest and asked to receive the tonsure. His father, having ambitions for him at the royal court as a senator, made sure that he received the best education possible in Paris for the liberal arts and Padua for law. During his time in Paris, due to the Calvinist heresy, a Calvinist notion of predestination was commonly held by many according to which it was thought that God predestines a soul to heaven or hell regardless of its merits. This doctrine cause much agony to Saint Francis. Having prayed throughout this period in his soul and finding no resolution through his studies, he turned to Our Lady of Good Deliverance (at that time in Saint Etienne des Grès in Paris) and prayed the Memorare. Immediately his doubt disappeared. This intercession of Our Lady became the foundation of Saint Francis's firm and solid devotion to the Holy Virgin and established in his soul a solid optimism about God, a firm trust and filial abandonment to His Divine Providence.

After his studies in Paris, he studied law and theology in Padua before returning home and receiving the priestly ordination in 1593. His first task was the return to the True Faith of the Chablais region of Savoy which had become Calvinist. After an arduous work over five years, the whole region returned to the Catholic Faith. He was consecrated Bishop in 1602 on December 8th and immediately took charge of his diocese. It was during this time that he wrote the Introduction to the Devout Life, a best-seller second only to the Bible, and the Treatise on the Love of God. In 1610, with Saint Jane Frances de Chantal, he founded the Order of the Visitation. After many more years spent in the administration of his diocese, and the care of the Visitation, the saintly Bishop of Geneva was called home on December 28, 1622.

Saint Francis de Sales was always joyful, with a joy founded in God's care for His People. He always encouraged his people to strive to overcome all melancholy and sorrowful moods. He always stressed that this joy should come from a firm conviction of our belonging to God and our adhesion to His Will: God makes us His own, for we will be very happy in this, all the rest is vanity and spiritual affliction.
