## ABOUT ST. JOSEPH SHRINE

A magnificent Victorian Gothic edifice completed in 1873 and noted as of national architectural significance, St. Joseph Shrine is a landmark center of Catholic Faith, culture, and community in Detroit's historic Eastern Market district. Since October 2016, the Canons of the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest have served and led the local faithful by bringing daily Masses, regular devotions, liturgical instruction, and an active parish life. As a result, the parish community at St. Joseph Shrine continues to grow, enriching both young and old, individuals and families from all backgrounds and neighborhoods.

In July 2013, St. Joseph was merged with two nearby parishes. Then in October 2016, St. Joseph became its own parish under the spiritual and pastoral care of the Institute of Christ the King. **In March 2020, the Parish was granted the designation of Archdiocesan Shrine** in recognition of its vibrant spiritual growth and daily life.

### **ABOUT THE INSTITUTE - SAINT BENEDICT**

Saint Benedict, the father of western monasticism, was born the son of a Roman noble of Nursia (today Norcia in Umbria) in Italy in approximately the year 480. He was sent to Rome to study, but was scandalized by the debauchery of Roman life. At the age of twenty, he left his studies and lived as a hermit in Enfide near Subiaco. After several years, having grown in virtue and knowledge of himself and his fellow man, the monks of a nearby monastery who had been taking care of him entreated him to serve as their abbot. After much persuasion, despite knowing that it would quite likely end in failure, he accepted. Saint Benedict was right, the monks eventually tried to poison him, but the cup of wine shattered when he blessed it. He left that monastery, and founded twelve others in the vicinity of Subiaco. In 530 he founded the great monastery of Monte Cassino which is on top of a hill between Rome and Naples. He died on March 21, 547.

Saint Benedict is most famous for the Rule that he gave his monks by which they were to live and organize their life in community. The monastery where they were to live according to the Rule was to be a school where monks were to learn how to serve God. Benedict wrote the Rule in 516 for monks living communally under the authority of an abbot. Seventy-three short chapters comprise the Rule. Its wisdom is twofold: spiritual (how to live a Christocentric life on earth) and administrative (how to run a monastery efficiently). More than half of the chapters describe how to be obedient and humble, and what to do when a member of the community is not. About one-fourth regulate the work of God (the *opus Dei*). One-tenth outline how, and by whom, the monastery should be managed. Following the golden rule of *Ora et Labora* - pray and work, the monks each day devoted eight hours to prayer, eight hours to sleep, and eight hours to manual work, sacred reading and/or works of charity.

Saint Benedict was chosen as a patron of the Institute particularly for the liturgy. At the age of twenty, when he was disgusted by the moral filth and debauchery in the fallen remains of the Roman Empire, he left the world. After several years of meditation, he understood that it was only by a return to the proper worship of God that society could be restored to its proper self. Therefore to this day, nothing in the life of a Benedictine monk is allowed to supersede the liturgy and divine office - *Opus Dei*. When God is treated properly, man will be treated rightly as well.

**Nota Bene:** The **General Chapter** of the Institute will take place between **August 24 - 28** this year. Please be assured that the Mass and Sacrament schedule will be maintained.
