## ABOUT ST. JOSEPH SHRINE

A magnificent Victorian Gothic edifice completed in 1873 and noted as of national architectural significance, St. Joseph Shrine is a landmark center of Catholic Faith, culture, and community in Detroit's historic Eastern Market district. Since October 2016, the Canons of the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest have served and led the local faithful by bringing daily Masses, regular devotions, liturgical instruction, and an active parish life. As a result, the parish community at St. Joseph Shrine continues to grow, enriching both young and old, individuals and families from all backgrounds and neighborhoods.

In July 2013, St. Joseph was merged with two nearby parishes. Then in October 2016, St. Joseph became its own parish under the spiritual and pastoral care of the Institute of Christ the King. **In March 2020, the Parish was granted the designation of Archdiocesan Shrine** in recognition of its vibrant spiritual growth and daily life.

#### **ABOUT THE INSTITUTE - SAINT THÉRÈSE OF LISIEUX**

Saint Thérèse of Lisieux, Patroness of Missionaries, also known as the Little Flower of Jesus, has been a highly influential model of sanctity for Catholics because of the simplicity and practicality of her approach to the spiritual life. She was given a very catholic upbringing and education by her parents. Known to be hypersensitive in her young age particularly after the loss of her mother at the age of four and a half, and the departures of her older sisters for the Carmel at the ages of nine and thirteen, left Saint Thérèse devastated.

At the entry of her sister Pauline for the Carmel, she developed nervous tremors and was only cured from them after gazing upon a statue of Our Lady. Four years later, after Marie entered the Carmel, she overcome these troubles of nervousness and scrupulosity while opening her Christmas presents jubilantly borne by a desire to please her father. In her account, nine years later (1895): "In an instant Jesus, content with my good will, accomplished the work I had not been able to do in ten years." After nine sad years she had "recovered the strength of soul she had lost" when her mother died and, she said, "she was to retain it forever." She discovered the joy in self-forgetfulness and added, "I felt, in a word, charity enter my heart, the need to forget myself to make others happy - Since this blessed night I was not defeated in any battle, but instead I went from victory to victory and began, so to speak, "to run a giant's course" (Ps. 19:5).

From then on, Saint Thérèse matured noticeably and pleased her father enormously by deciding within the year to follow her older sisters into the Carmel. It was during her trip through Italy, with the famous stop in Rome to ask Pope Leo XIII permission to enter the Carmel early, that she understood that priests, despite their supreme dignity that placed them above the angels, were nonetheless men subject to human weakness, and therefore, were in need of much prayer. Thus she found her vocation in the Carmel of Lisieux which had prayer for priests as a part of its apostolate. Driven, to pursue sanctity, after six years in the Carmel, she discovered what she became famous for after her death: the little way or *la petite voie*. In many ways, it resembles the openness of the heart and will to God's will as taught by Saint Francis de Sales. It is for her vocation of being an apostle to apostles and her desire to spend her heaven doing good on earth that she was chosen to be the Institute's patron for the missions.
