ABOUT ST. JOSEPH SHRINE

A magnificent Victorian Gothic edifice completed in 1873 and noted as of national architectural significance, St. Joseph Shrine is a landmark center of Catholic Faith, culture, and community in Detroit's historic Eastern Market district. Since October 2016, the Canons of the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest have served and led the local faithful by bringing daily Masses, regular devotions, liturgical instruction, and an active parish life. As a result, the parish community at St. Joseph Shrine continues to grow, enriching both young and old, individuals and families from all backgrounds and neighborhoods.

In July 2013, St. Joseph was merged with two nearby parishes. Then in October 2016, St. Joseph became its own parish under the spiritual and pastoral care of the Institute of Christ the King. **In March 2020, the Parish was granted the designation of Archdiocesan Shrine** in recognition of its vibrant spiritual growth and daily life.

DID YOU KNOW?

... that the Feast of Easter must be prepared for by a forty-days' recollection and penance. Those forty-days are one of the principal Seasons of the Liturgical Year, and one of the most powerful means employed by the Church for exciting in the hearts of her children the spirit of their Christian vocation. It is of the utmost importance, that such a Season of penance should produce its work in our souls - the renovation of the whole spiritual life. **The Church, therefore, has instituted a preparation for the holy time of Lent - the three weeks of Septuagesima**, during which she withdraws us, from the noisy distractions of the world, in order that our hearts may be the more readily impressed by the solemn warning she is to give us, at the commencement of Lent, by marking our foreheads with ashes. The leading feature of Septuagesima is the total suspension of the *Alleluia*, which is not to be again heard until Easter. The sweet Hymn of the Angels, *Gloria in excelsis Deo*, is also taken from us. At the end of the Mass, the Deacon will no longer dismiss the Faithful with his solemn *Ite, Missa est*, but will simply invite them to continue their prayers [*Benedicamus Domino*].
