

Confessions Available at St. Stanislaus

The Sacrament of Penance will continue to be offered at St. Stanislaus. Confessions will be heard Monday through Sunday, 30 minutes prior to each live streaming of the Mass (See Mass time schedule)

The outdoor confessional is located in the west parking lot of the church off of Sixth Street. Please form a single file line into the parking lot and remain in your vehicle until it is your turn for Confession. After completion of your Confession please exit the parking lot in your vehicle. This procedure will guarantee the social distance minimum and 10 person requirement of the Governor's office.

St. Stanislaus, Bishop and Martyr

Thursday, May 7th, is the feast day of St. Stanislaus of Cracow, Bishop and Martyr. He lived in the 11th century, in Poland. Our church is dedicated to him and he is represented in our church in a variety of places.

Inside, the statue of St. Stanislaus watches over us as we go in and out the parking lot entrance. His relic is at his feet. He is also featured in the stained glass window on the epistle side of the sanctu-

In addition, the bas relief over the main altar depicts St. Stanislaus presenting a man who he had raised from the dead, in order to testify in a court case. There is also a 2nd statue of St. Stanislaus outside, along the south side of our church.

VIRUS PROTECTION

The Cross of Zacharias is a sacramental, a printed cross with letters and symbols representing lines in a prayer against pestilence. The prayer is attributed to St. Zacharias who was the patriarch of Jerusalem in the 7th century. It was efficacious against a plague during his Patriarchate. This sacramental is meant to be carried in your purse or pocket. Printed cards are available, just inside the parking lot entrance to church for your use. The fathers of the Council of Trent were also saved from a plague by wearing these during the council in the 16th century. May God protect us.

Prayers in Time of Pestilence

The second Collect, Secret and Postcommunion at all of our Masses will be from the Votive Mass In Time of Pestilence. You will find that Mass in the Votive Mass section of your hand missal.

This will be for as long as the present virus situation continues.

Prayer of Spiritual Communion

Jesus, really present in the Most Holy Sacrament of the altar, since I cannot now receive thee under the sacramental veil, I beseech thee, with a heart full of love and longing, to come spiritually into my soul through the Immaculate Heart of thy most Holy Mother, and to abide with me, thou in me, and I in thee, in time and in eternity. Amen.
