INTROIT. *Ps. 65, 4.* Let all the earth adore Thee, O God, and sing to Thee: let it sing a psalm to Thy name, O Thou most high. *Ps. 65, 1, 2.* Shout with joy to God all the earth, Sing ye a psalm to His name, give glory to His praise. *V.* Glory.

PRAYER. Almighty, eternal God, Who dost govern all things in heaven and on earth, of Thy mercy hear the supplications of Thy people, and grant Thy peace in our times. Through our Lord.

EPISTLE. *Rom. 12, 6-16.* Brethren, having different gifts, according to the grace that is given us; either prophecy, to be used according to the rule of faith; or ministry, in ministering; or he that teacheth in doctrine; he that exhorteth in exhorting; he that giveth with simplicity; he that ruleth with carefulness; he that showeth mercy with cheerfulness. Let love be without dissimulation. Hating that which is evil, cleaving to that which is good. Loving one another with the charity of brotherhood, in honor preventing one another. In carefulness, not slothful: in spirit fervent: serving the Lord: rejoicing in hope: patient in tribulation: instant in prayer: communication to the necessities of the saints; pursuing hospitality. Bless them that persecute you: bless, and curse not. Rejoice with them that rejoice, weep with them that weep. Being of one mind one towards another; not minding high things, but consenting to the humble.

GRADUAL. *Ps. 106, 20, 21.* The Lord sent His word, and healed them: and delivered them out of their distresses. *V.* Let the mercies of the Lord give glory to Him: and His wonderful works to the children of men. Alleluia, alleluia. *V.* *Ps. 148, 2.* Praise ye the Lord, all His angels: praise ye Him, all His hosts. Alleluia.

GOSPEL. *John 2, 1-11.* At that time, there was a marriage in Cana of Galilee: and the mother of Jesus was there. And Jesus also was invited, and His disciples, to the marriage. And the wine failing, the mother of Jesus saith to Him, They have no wine. And Jesus saith to her, Woman, what is it to Me and to thee? My hour is not yet come. His mother saith to the waiters, Whatsoever He shall say to you, do ye. Now there were set there six water pots of stone, according to the manner of the purifying of the Jews, containing two or three measures apiece. Jesus saith to them, Fill the water pots with water. And they filled them up to the brim. And Jesus saith to them, Draw out now, and carry to the chief steward of the feast: and they carried it. And when the chief steward had tasted the water made wine, and knew not whence it was, but the waiters knew who had drawn the water: the chief steward calleth the bridegroom, and saith to him,

Every man at first setteth forth good wine, and when man have well drunk, then that which is worse: but thou hast kept the good wine until now. This beginning of miracles did Jesus in Cana of Galilee; and manifested His glory, and His disciples believed in Him.

OFFERTORY. *Ps. 65, 1, 2, 16.* Shout with joy to God, all the earth: sing ye a psalm to His name: come and hear, and I will tell you, all ye that fear God, what great things the Lord hath done for my soul. Alleluia.

SECRET. Sanctify, O Lord, the gifts we offer, and purify us from the stains of our sins. Through our Lord.

COMMUNION. *John 2, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11.* The Lord saith: Fill the waterpots with water, and carry to the chief steward of the feast. When the chief steward had tasted the water made wine, he said to the bridegroom: thou hast kept the good wine until now; this first miracle did Jesus before His disciples.

POSTCOMMUNION. May the working of Thy power, we beg Thee, O Lord, be increased in us, that being nourished by divine sacraments, we may by Thy grace be prepared to obtain that which they promise. Through our Lord.

PROCESSIONAL: WHAT CHILD IS THIS?

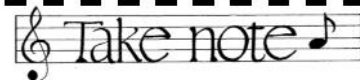
What child is this, who laid to rest,

**WELCOME TO
ST. MARY ORATORY**

With the gracious permission of Bishop David Malloy, Bishop of Rockford, the extraordinary form of Holy Mass is offered at St. Mary by the *Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest*. We are pleased to have you join us in this venerable act of worship and invite you to return often.

In the traditional Mass everyone has his proper role whether it be celebrant, choir, server, usher, or congregation. At High Mass, the choir makes all responses simply because that is their function. The congregation, on the other hand, responds internally, as opposed to vocally, and this is still, according to Pope Pius XII in his encyclical "Mediator Dei" active participation. Active participation is wide-ranging, such as singing, silent meditation or even recitation of the Rosary during Mass, because active participation does not necessitate vocal responses but unity of intent with the celebrant (priest). To assist at Mass more fully, use the missals provided in the pews, paying particular attention to any notes in the margin. All the "propers," scriptural parts of the Mass, proper to the day. These can be found in the bulletin. Simply follow those around you as to when one should stand, sit, or kneel. Lastly, please keep a "holy silence" in the church at all times, out of respect for Christ's presence in the tabernacle. Since there is no mixing of the old and new rites, Holy Communion is to be received on the tongue while kneeling at the altar rail. the response "Amen" is not said by the communicant when receiving the Host.
