


### *St. Francis de Sales thoughts for meditation:*

## On the Good of Patience

*From the exposition of St. Cyprian, Bishop and Martyr*



In speaking of patience, beloved brethren, and in preaching on its benefits and advantages, how can I better begin than by pointing out the fact that now, just for you to listen to me, I see that patience is necessary, as you could not even do this, namely, listen and learn, without patience. For only then is the word of

God and way of salvation effectively learned, if one listens with patience to what is being said. Dearly beloved brethren, there are divers paths of heavenly wisdom, wherein we are invited to walk, if we would reach in the end the reward which God has prepared to crown hope and faith but I find no path more useful toward life, nor more sure toward glory than this, that while we humbly strive, in all fear, and in all godliness, to obey the commandments of the Lord, we should set our chiefest guard in an unceasing watch over our patience. The philosophers also say that they take this path, but their patience is as much a sham as their wisdom is a cheat, for who can be wise or patient who knows nothing of God's wisdom or God's patience? Let it be ours, then, to show forth by spiritual watchfulness that patience which is a part of the teaching which we have learnt from heaven. Patience is one of His Own virtues whereof God has made us partakers with Him; our Great Head is the Captain of the patient, and it is through patience that He has crowned Himself with glory and honor.

But as for us, dearly beloved brethren, we are the real philosophers, whose wisdom lies not in words but in deeds, and is manifested not in appearance but in the truth. We are they whose knowledge has the inward consciousness, not the idle boasting, of strength. We are not speakers of high-sounding words. Yes, God is Himself the Source, the Fountain, and the Greatness of patience, and it behooves man to love what is beloved of God. That good thing which he loves is commended unto him of God's Majesty. If God be our Lord and Father, let us follow after the example of our Lord and Father's patience, since it is the duty of servants to be obedient, and of sons to be home-minded.

By our patience God draws us toward Himself, and

keeps us His Own. Patience does soothe anger, bridle the tongue, govern the mind, keep peace, set rules of self-control, break the onset of lust, still the swelling of temper, put out the fire begotten of hatred, make the rich meek, and relieve the need of the poor. Patience does guard in virgins their blessed wholeness; in widows, their careful purity; in such as be married, their single-hearted love one toward the other. Patience does teach such as be successful to be lowly-minded; such as be unfortunate, to be brave; and all to be gentle when they are wronged and insulted. Patience makes a man soon to forgive them that trespass against him, and if he have trespassed against any, long and humbly to ask his pardon. Patience does fight down temptations, bear persecution, and endure unto the end in suffering, and in uplifting of our testimony. Patience is the moat that guards the stout foundations of the castle of our faith.



## EXTERNAL SOLEMNITY OF ST. GIANNA BERETTA MOLLA

**INTROIT:** *Ps. 118: 75, 120, 1* I know, O Lord, that Thy judgments are equity, and in Thy truth Thou hast humbled me: pierce Thou my flesh with Thy fear, I am afraid of Thy judgments. Alleluia, alleluia. (Ps) Blessed are the undefiled in the way who walk in the law of the Lord. Glory be. I know, O Lord...

**COLLECT:** Hear us, O God our Savior: and as we rejoice in the feast of blessed Gianna Beretta Molla, so we may learn a filial devotion to Thee. Through the same our Lord.

**COLLECT:** (4th Sunday after Easter) O God, Who makest the faithful to be of one mind and will: grant to Thy people the grace to love what Thou dost command and to desire what Thou dost promise, that amid the changes of the world, our hearts may there be fixed where true joys are to be found. Through Our Lord.

**EPISTLE:** *Prov. 31: 10-31* Who shall find a valiant woman? Far and from the uttermost coasts is the price of her. The heart of her husband trusteth in her, and he shall have no need of spoils. She will render hem good, and not evil, all the days of her life. She hath sought wool and flax, and hath wrought by the counsel of her hands. She is like the merchant's ship, she bringeth her bread from afar. And she hath risen in the night, and given a prey to her household, and victuals to her maidens. She hath considered a field, and bought it: with the fruit of her hand she hath planted a vineyard. She hath girded her loins with strength, and hath strengthened her arm. She hath tasted and seen that her traffic is good: her lamp shall not be put out in the night. She hath put out her hand to

strong things, and her fingers have taken hold of the spindle. She hath opened her hand to the needy, and stretched out her hands to the poor. She shall not fear for her house in the cold of snow: for all her domestics are clothed with double garments. She hath made for herself clothing of tapestry: fine linen and purple is her covering. Her husband is honorable in the gates, when he sitteth among the senators of the land. She made fine linen and sold it, and delivered a girdle to the Chanaanite. Strength and beauty are her clothing, and she shall laugh in the latter day. She hath opened her mouth to wisdom, and the law of clemency is on her tongue. She hath looked well to the paths of her house, and hath not eaten her bread idle. Her children rose up, and called her blessed: her husband, and he praised her. Many daughters have gathered together riches: thou hast surpassed them all. Favor is deceitful, and beauty is vain: the woman that feareth the Lord, she shall be praised. Give her of the fruit of her hands: and let her works praise her in the gates.

**PASCHAL ALLELUIA:** *Ps. 44: 5* Alleluia, alleluia. With thy comeliness and thy beauty set out, proceed prosperously, and reign.

Alleluia. Because of truth, and meekness, and justice: and thy right hand shall conduct thee wonderfully. Alleluia.

**GOSPEL:** *Mt. 13: 44-52* At that time, Jesus spoke to His disciples this parable: The Kingdom of heaven is like unto a treasure hidden in a field. Which a man having found, hid it, and for joy thereof goeth and selleth all that he hath, and buyeth that field. Again the kingdom of heaven is like to a merchant seeking good pearls. Who, when he had found one pearl of great price, went his way, and sold all that he had, and bought it. Again the kingdom of heaven is like to a net cast into the sea, and gathering together of all kind of fishes. Which, when it was filled, they drew out, and sitting by the shore, they chose out the good into vessels, but the bad they cast forth. So shall it be at the end of the world: the angels shall go out, and shall separate the wicked from among the just, and shall

cast them into the furnace of fire: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. Have ye understood all these things? They say to him: Yes. He said unto them: Therefore every scribe instructed in the kingdom of heaven is like to a man that is a householder, who bringeth forth out of his treasure new things and old.

**OFFERTORY: Ps. 44: 3** Grace is poured abroad in thy lips: therefore hath God blessed thee for ever.

Alleluia.

**SECRET:** May this sacrifice of Thy dedicated people be accepted by Thee, O Lord, in honor of Thy Saints: to whose merits we attribute the help afforded us in tribulation. Through our Lord.

**SECRET:** (4th Sunday after Easter) O God, Who by the holy interchange of this sacrifice dost make us partakers of the One Supreme Godhead: grant, we beseech Thee, that as we know Thy truth, so we may worthily live it. Through our Lord.

**PREFACE FOR EASTERTIDE:** It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, at all times to praise Thee, O Lord, but more gloriously at this time above others when Christ our Pasch was sacrificed. For He is the true Lamb Who took away the sins of the world: Who by dying destroyed our death, and by rising again hath restored us to life. And therefore with Angels and Archangels, with Thrones and Dominations, and with all the hosts of the heavenly army, we sing a hymn to Thy glory, saying: Holy, Holy, Holy...

**COMMUNION: Ps. 44: 8** Thou hast loved justice and hated iniquity: therefore God, they God, hast anointed thee with the oil of gladness above thy fellows. Alleluia.

**POSTCOMMUNION:** Thou hast filled Thy household, O Lord, with holy gifts: do Thou cherish us always, through the intercession of her whose festival we are keeping. Through our Lord.

**POSTCOMMUNION:** (4th Sunday after Easter) Stand by us, O Lord our God, so that what we have confidently received may cleanse us from every vice and free us from every danger. Through our Lord.
