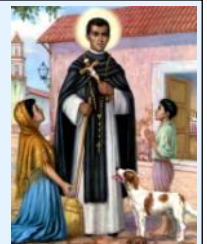

## ***Conformity to the Will of God***

*By St. Francis de Sales*

Look not to the matter of your actions, which may be contemptible in itself, but to the honor they possess in being willed by God, ordered in His providence, arranged in His wisdom. Purity of heart consists in valuing all things according to the weights of the sanctuary, which are nothing else than the will of God; do not love, then, anything too ardently, not even virtue, which we sometimes lose, by wishing for it beyond the bounds of moderation.

Our centre is the will of God; God wishes that I should do this action now, God desires this matter of me, what more is necessary? While I do this, I am not obliged to do anything else.

O God, may Thy will be done, not only in the execution of Thy commandments, counsels, and inspirations, which we ought to obey, but also in suffering the afflictions which befall us; may Thy will be done in us and by us in everything that pleases Thee! [A soul truly submissive to the will of God is attached to nothing created; it knows that all things, out of God, are vanity and nothingness; hence it has no other end or object in view than to die to itself, and to be resigned fully, always, and in all things. — Henry Suso. St. Vincent de Paul excelled in this point, living detached from himself and from all creatures. His constant endeavor was to be conformed to the good pleasure of God, and to adore lovingly the arrangements of His Providence. ]

The truly loving heart loves the divine good pleasure, not only in consolations, but in afflictions; it even loves pains, crosses, and labors more, because the chief mark of love is, that it makes the lover suffer for the beloved. And why should we not endure the same hand of the Lord, when it dispenses afflictions as when it distributes consolations? Oh, how good a thing it is to live only in God, to labor only in God, to rejoice only in God !

Oh, if the holy will of God reigned in us, how happy should we be! We should never commit any sin, or live according to our irregular inclinations, for that holy will is the rule of all excellence and sanctity. It is self-love, says St. Bernard, that burns eternally in hell, for it ruins and destroys whatever it touches. If found in heaven, it is cast out; for the angels were banished only because of self-will, because they wished to become like God, and on that account were precipitated into hell. If found on earth, it robs man of grace, and subjects him to death, as to our first parents in the terrestrial paradise. In a word, it brings misfortune alone; and, therefore, when we discover anything within us

not conformed to the will of God, we should prostrate ourselves before Him, and say to Him that we detest and disown our own will, and everything in us that could displease Him, or that is contrary to His holy love, promising Him never to wish for anything but what will be conformable to His divine good pleasure.

Let us open the arms of our will, embrace lovingly the Cross, and acquiesce in the most holy will of God, singing to Him this hymn of resignation and conformity: *Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven!*

### *External Solemnity*

#### *of the Immaculate Heart of Mary*

**INTROIT:** *Heb 4: 16* Let us come with confidence to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and may find grace in seasonable aid. *Ps. 44: 2* My heart hath uttered a good word: I speak my works to the King. Glory be. Let us come with...

**COLLECT:** Almighty everlasting God, Who in the heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary didst prepare a dwelling worthy of the Holy Ghost: grant in Thy mercy, that we who with devout minds celebrate the festival of that immaculate heart, may be able to live according to Thine own Heart. Through our Lord...

**COLLECT:** (*14th Sunday after Pentecost*) Keep, we beseech thee, O Lord, Thy Church with perpetual peace; and because the frailty of man without Thee cannot but fall, keep us ever by Thy help from all things hurtful, and lead us to all things profitable to our salvation. Through our Lord...

**EPISTLE:** *Ecclus. 24: 23-31* As the vine I have brought forth a pleasant odor, and my flowers are the fruit of honor and riches. I am the mother of fair love, and of fear, and of knowledge, and of holy hope. In me is all grace of the way and of the truth, in me is all hope of life and of virtue. Come over to me, all ye that desire me, and be filled with my fruits; for my spirit is sweet above honey, and mine inheritance above honey and the honey-comb. My memory is unto everlasting generations. They that eat me, shall yet hunger; and they that drink me, shall yet thirst. He that hearkeneth to me shall not be confounded, and they that work by me shall not sin. They that explain me shall have life everlasting.

**GRADUAL:** *Ps. 12: 6; 44: 18* My heart shall rejoice in Thy salvation: I will sign to the Lord, Who giveth me good things: yea I will sing to the name of the Lord the most High. They shall remember Thy name throughout all generations. Therefore shall people praise thee for ever.

**ALLELUIA:** *Lk. 1: 46-47* Alleluia, alleluia. My soul doth magnify the Lord and my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Savior. Alleluia.

**GOSPEL:** *Jn. 19: 25-27* At that time, there stood by the cross of Jesus, His Mother and His Mother's sister, Mary of Cleophas, and Mary Magdalen. When Jesus therefore had seen His Mother and the disciple standing whom He loved, He saith to His Mother: Woman, behold thy son. After that He saith to the disciple: Behold thy Mother. And from that hour the disciple took her to his own.

**OFFERTORY:** *Lk. 1: 46-47* My spirit hath rejoiced in God my Savior: because He that is mighty hath done great thing to me and holy is His name.

**SECRET:** We who offer to Thy majesty the Lamb without blemish, beseech Thee, O Lord, that our hearts may be kindled by that divine fire which so ineffably inflamed the heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Through the same our Lord...

**SECRET:** (*14th Sunday after Pentecost*) Grant, we beseech Thee, O Lord, that the saving victim we offer, may both atone for our sins, and propitiate for

us Thine almighty power. Through our Lord...

**PREFACE OF OUR LADY:** It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto Thee, O holy Lord, Father almighty, everlasting God: and that we should praise and bless, and proclaim Thee, in the Festivity of the Blessed Mary, ever-Virgin: Who also conceived Thine only-begotten Son by the overshadowing of the Holy Ghost, and the glory of her virginity still abiding, gave forth to the world the everlasting Light, Jesus Christ our Lord. Through whom the Angels praise Thy Majesty, the Dominations worship it, and the Powers stand in awe. The Heavens and the heavenly hosts together with the blessed Seraphim in triumphant chorus unite to celebrate it. Together with these we entreat Thee that Thou mayest bid our voices also to be admitted while we say with lowly praise: Holy, Holy, Holy...

**COMMUNION:** *Jn. 19: 26-27* Jesus saith to His mother: Woman, behold thy son. After that, He saith to the disciple: Behold thy mother. And from that hour, the disciple took her to his own.

**POSTCOMMUNION:** Refreshed by these divine gifts we humbly beseech Thee, O Lord, that by the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary whose immaculate heart we now solemnly celebrate, we may be delivered from present dangers and obtain the joys of eternal life. Through our Lord...

**POSTCOMMUNION:** *(14th Sunday after Pentecost)* May thy sacraments, O God, at all times purify and strengthen us, and through them may we attain to eternal salvation. Through our Lord...

**LAST GOSPEL:** *Mt. 6: 24-33* At that time: Jesus said to his disciples: No man can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will sustain the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon. Therefore I say to you: Be not solicitous for your life, what you shall eat, nor for your body, what you shall put on. Is not the life more than the meat, and the body more than the raiment? Behold the birds of the air; for they neither sow nor do they reap, nor gather into barns, and your heavenly Father feedeth them. Are not

you of much more value than they? And which of you, by taking thought, can add to his stature one cubit? And for raiment, why are you solicitous? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they labor not, neither do they spin. But I say to you, that not even Solomon in all his glory was arrayed as one of these. And, if the grass of the field, which is today, and tomorrow is cast into the oven, God doth so clothe, how much more you, O ye of little faith! Be not solicitous, therefore, saying: What shall we eat, or what shall we drink, or wherewith shall we be clothed? For after all these things do the heathens seek. For your Father knoweth that you have need of all these things. Seek ye therefore first the kingdom of God, and his justice; and all these things shall be added unto you.

### ***Prayer to the Immaculate Heart of Mary***

Heart of Mary, Mother of God, our Mother, Heart most amiable, on which the Adorable Trinity ever looks with complacency, worthy of all the veneration and tenderness of angels and of men; Heart most like the Heart of Jesus, whose most perfect image thou art; heart full of goodness, ever compassionate towards our miseries, - vouchsafe to thaw our icy hearts, that they may be changed entirely to the likeness of the heart of Jesus. Infuse into them the love of thy virtues, inflame them with that blessed fire with which thou dost ever burn. In thee let the Holy Church find safe shelter; protect it, and be its sweet asylum, its tower of strength, impregnable against every inroad of its enemies. Be thou the road leading to Jesus; be thou the channel whereby we receive all graces needful for our salvation. Be thou our help in need, our comfort in trouble, our strength in temptation, our refuge in persecution, our aid in all dangers; but especially in the last struggle of our life, at the moment of our death, when all hell will be unchained against us to snatch away our souls, - in that dread moment, that hour so terrible, whereon our eternity depends, and, yes, most tender Virgin, do thou then make us feel how great is the sweetness of thy motherly Heart, and the strength of thy power with the Heart of Jesus, by opening for us a safe refuge in the very fount of mercy itself, whereby we too may one day join with thee in Paradise in praising that same Heart of Jesus for ever and for ever.
