### *St. Francis de Sales* *thoughts for meditation:*

On our journey through life we do not wish to meet any difficulties or contradictions. We want constant consolations, no periods of dryness, no unpleasant times; health without sickness, repose without work, and peace without disturbance! But can't you see our folly when we want to have something we cannot have? Unallayed good is found only in paradise, as in hell is found nothing but evil. The great Chrysostom says: "O man, you who get all upset when things do not always go your way, are you not ashamed when you ponder that what you want was not to be found even in the family of Our Lord? ... Consider, I beg you, the events, the contradictions, and all the things that happened. The angel of the Lord said in a dream to Saint Joseph, 'Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt. Stay there until I tell you otherwise. Herod is searching for the child to destroy him.' [Mt. 2:13] This, indeed, was a moment of great sorrow for the Virgin Mary and for good Saint Joseph." (Spiritual Discourses III; O. Beginning on the feast of the Chair of St. Peter of Rome on Jan. 18, we pray until the feast of the conversion of St. Paul on Jan. 25 for the return to the fullness of the Catholic Church those separated brethren currently outside the Church of Christ. This is in particular a great time to pray for fallen away family members! During these dates, there will be a Collect, Secret, and Post-Communion added to each Mass for this intention.

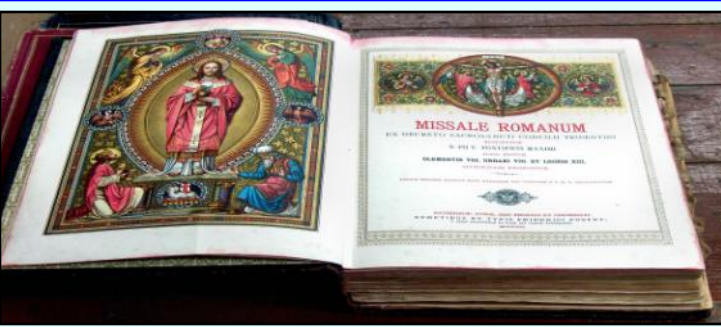

## Feast of the Holy Family

**Introit** *Prov 23:24-25* **T**he father of the Just will exult with glee; let Your father and mother have joy; let her who bore You exult. *Ps 83:2-3* How lovely is Your dwelling place, O Lord of Hosts! My soul yearns and pines for the courts of the Lord. *V.* Glory be to the Father... **T**he father of the ...

**Collect** O Lord Jesus Christ, You Who while subject to Mary and Joseph, hallowed family life with virtues beyond description, grant us by their combined intercession, that, having been taught by the example of the Holy Family, we may attain unto their everlasting companionship. **Who** livest...

**Lesson** *Col 3:12-17* Brethren: Put on, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, a heart of mercy, kindness, humility, meekness, patience. Bear with one another and forgive one another, if anyone has a grievance against any other; even as the Lord has forgiven you, so also do you forgive. But above all these things have charity, which is the bond of perfection. And may the peace of Christ reign in your hearts; unto that peace, indeed, you were called in one body. Show yourselves thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you abundantly: in all wisdom teach and admonish one another by psalms, hymns and spiritual songs, singing in your hearts to God by His grace. Whatever you do in word or in work, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, giving thanks to God the Father through Jesus Christ our Lord.

**Gradual** *Ps 26:4* One thing I ask of the Lord; this I seek: to dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life. *V.* *Ps 83:5* Happy they who dwell in Your house. O Lord! continually they praise You. Alleluia, alleluia. *Isa 45:15* *V.* Truly You are a hidden God, the God of Israel, the Savior. Alleluia.

**Gospel** *Luke 2:42-52* When Jesus was twelve years old, they went up to Jerusalem according to the custom of the feast. And after they had fulfilled the days, when they were returning, the Boy Jesus remained in Jerusalem, and His parents did not know it. But thinking that He was in the caravan, they had come a day's journey before it occurred to them to look for Him among their relatives and acquaintances. And not finding Him, they returned to Jerusalem in search of Him. And it came to pass after three days, that they found Him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. And all who were listening to Him were amazed at His understanding and His answers. And when they saw Him, they were astonished. And His Mother said to Him, Son, why have You done so to us? Behold, in sorrow Your father and I have been seeking You. And He said to them, How is it that you sought Me? Did you not know that I must be about My Father's business? And they did not understand the word that He spoke to them. And He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was subject to them; and His Mother kept all these things carefully in her heart. And Jesus advanced in wisdom and age and grace before God and men.

**Offertory** *Luke 2:22* The parents of Jesus took Him up to Jerusalem, to present Him to the Lord.

**Secret** In appeasement, O Lord, we offer You this sacrifice, humbly praying that through the intercession of the virgin Mother of God, and that of St. Joseph, You will establish our households in Your peace and grace. **Through** the same...

**Communion** *Luke 2:51* Jesus went down with them, and came to Nazareth and was subject to them.

**Post Communion** Grant, Lord Jesus, that those whom You refresh with the heavenly sacrament may ever imitate the example of Your Holy Family, so that at the hour of our death, with the glorious Virgin Mary and St. Joseph welcoming us, we may be found worthy to be received into Your everlasting home. **Who** livest...
