Dear Faithful,

One of my resolutions for this upcoming Pastoral Year is to make parish life safer for you the Faithful, for our employees and volunteers, and most importantly for our children.

Our beautiful church is the House of God and a valuable historic landmark and beacon of our Catholic Faith, and our members are children of God and living members of His Church. This past year I've done a lot of observing about how to raise the bar in many aspects of parish life. Following repeated incidences requiring Police intervention, vandalism, unwanted intruders, trashing of church grounds, and several cases of theft, I will be making some changes in the near future. I thank you in advance for your comprehension, for your understanding, and your cooperation. Other than the spiritual good of souls, safety is one of the most important priorities to me. The last thing I want is for the Faithful to feel unwelcome or unsafe on church grounds.

Reminders: any incident that you see, receive, observe or are hurt by **MUST** be reported by you to the office. Also, our #1 safety measure is being a good neighbor and watching out for one another. If you see something strange or something that is not acceptable, I must be informed via the office to take the proper steps to stop, correct, or prevent incidents in the future. Do not keep valuables in your car or at least hide them from view.

I want to also remind you of a policy that was implemented a few weeks back: *At church functions in the basement, the back door by the parking lot is to be closed and to remain shut once the activity has begun. An usher or similar is to be stationed near the door to answer it and let people in.*



## **Fourteenth Sunday after Pentecost**

**INTROIT: Ps. 83. 10-11** Behold, O God our protector, and look on the face of thy Christ : for better is one day in thy courts above thousands. Ps. 1-2: How lovely are thy tabernacles, O Lord of hosts : my soul longeth and fainteth for the courts of the Lord. Glory be. Behold, O God.....

**COLLECT:** Keep, we beseech thee, O Lord, Thy Church with perpetual peace; and because the frailty of man without Thee cannot but fall, keep us ever by Thy help from all things hurtful, and lead us to all things profitable to our salvation. Through Our Lord.

**COLLECT (Seven Sorrows of BVM):** O God, at Whose Passion, as Simeon foretold, the most sweet soul of Mary, Thy glorious and Virgin Mother, was pierced by a sword of sorrow; mercifully grant that we who reverently meditate upon her Sorrows, may reap the happy fruit of Thy Passion: Who livest and reignest.

**EPISTLE: Gal. 5:16-24** *A lesson from the Epistle of St Paul the Apostle to the Galatians*

Brethren: Walk in the spirit, and you shall not fulfil the lusts of the flesh : for the flesh lusteth against the spirit, and the spirit against the flesh: for these are contrary one to another : so that you do not the things that you would. But if you are led by the spirit, you are not under the Law. Now the works of the flesh are manifest; which are fornication, uncleanness, immodesty, luxury, idolatry, witchcrafts, enmities, contentions, emulations, wraths, quarrels, dissensions, sects, envies, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like, of the which I foretell you, as I have foretold to you, that they who do such things shall not obtain the kingdom of God. But the fruit of the Spirit is charity, joy, peace, patience, benignity, goodness, longanimity, mildness, faith, modesty, continency, chastity. Against such there is no law. And they that are Christ's have crucified their flesh with the vices and concupiscences.

**GRADUAL: Ps. 117: 8-9** It is good to confide in the Lord, rather than to have confidence in man. It is good to trust in the Lord, rather than to trust in princes.

**ALLELUIA:** Ps. 94:1 Alleluia, alleluia. Come let us praise the Lord with joy : let us joyfully sing to God our Savior. Alleluia.

**GOSPEL: Mt. 6:24-33** *+Continuation of the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew*

At that time: Jesus said to his disciples: No man can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will sustain the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon. Therefore I say to you: Be not solicitous for your life, what you shall eat, nor for your body, what you shall put on. Is not the life more than the meat, and the body more than the raiment? Behold the birds of the air; for they neither sow nor do they reap, nor gather into barns, and your heavenly Father feedeth them. Are not you of much more value than they? And which of you, by taking thought, can add to his stature one cubit? And for raiment, why are you solicitous? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they labor not, neither do they spin. But I say to you, that not even Solomon in all his glory was arrayed as one of these. And, if the grass of the field, which is today, and tomorrow is cast into the oven, God doth so clothe, how much more you, O ye of little faith! Be not solicitous, therefore, saying: What shall we eat, or what shall we drink, or wherewith shall we be clothed? For after all these things do the heathens seek. For your Father knoweth that you have need of all these things. Seek ye therefore first the kingdom of God, and his justice; and all these things shall be added unto you.

**OFFERTORY: Ps. 33:8-9** The Angel of the Lord shall encamp round about them that fear Him, and shall deliver them: O taste and see that the Lord is sweet!

**SECRET:** Grant , we beseech Thee, O Lord, that the saving victim we offer, may both atone for our sins, and propitiate for us Thine almighty power. Through our Lord.

**SECRET (Seven Sorrows of BVM):** We offer unto Thee our prayers and oblations, O Lord Jesus Christ, humbly beseeching Thee, that we who recall in our prayers the piercing of the most sweet soul of blessed Mary, Thy mother, through the merits of Thy death and the manifold intercession of Thy mother and her holy companions at the foot of the cross, may share the reward of the blessed. Who livest.

**COMMUNION: Mt. 6:33** Seek first the kingdom of God: and all things shall be added unto you, saith the Lord.

**POSTCOMMUNION:** May thy sacraments, O God, at all times purify and strengthen us, and through them may we attain to eternal salvation. Through our Lord.

**POSTCOMMUNION (Seven Sorrows of BVM):** May the divine sacrifice, O Lord Jesus Christ, of which we, commemorating the transfixion of Thy virgin Mother, have partaken, obtain for us from Thy mercy every good and salutary gift. Who livest and reignest.
