Dedication of the Basilica of St. Michael on Mount Gargano, (EF 1st Class) Sept. 29th

This "Celestial Basilica" is the only
place of Catholic worship not consecrated
by human hands but by St. Michael
himself between 492-493. "I
am the Archangel Michael, and am

always in the presence of God. The cave is sacred for me, I have chosen
it; I myself am its watchful custodian... There where the rock opens wide
the sins of men can be forgiven... What is asked for here in prayer will
be granted. Therefore, go to the mountain and dedicate the grotto to
the Christian religion". The first Holy Sacrifice of the Mass was
offered there on Sept. 29, 493 in gratitude for St. Michael's protection
against the pagan armies.

From the Rector's Desk

Dear Faithful,

As announced and having received your schedules for evening Mass and Confessions, I have made the **Mass Time changes** that you can see on the first page of the bulletin. Many faithful said that they desired an earlier Mass and would like to be home earlier to be with the family before they go to sleep, especially the little ones. I would like to try this schedule for the month of October and see what the response is like.

We have also introduced a **5pm Eucharistic Holy Hour every Thursday** before the evening Mass. Please use this time to make reparation for the many sins committed against the Sacred Heart of Our Lord and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Reparation is at the center of these devotions as revealed to St. Catherine Labouré and the holy children of Fatima.

I am also desperately asking for more volunteers for the St. Martin de Porres Meal Program! Last week, I helped our volunteers hand out food to the homeless and needy in our area at our Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday meal programs (3-4pm) and I realized how much help they need. Because of a volunteer shortage for the Meal Program, Mrs. Sylvia Cordova, our Office Manager, sometimes has to step out of the office to fill in. In addition to just doing the many tasks of distributing food, they're short-handed for their own safety. Starting now, I'm asking for 4 volunteers at each distribution with at least 2 being men. Currently, we have only 2 volunteers scheduled per day and if someone cannot make it, our Office Manager has to fill in. Giving food to the hungry is a *Corporal Work of Mercy* and a great opportunity for us to witness and spread our faith and love our neighbor in God. If you can commit to 2 times a month, we'd need only 9 new volunteers. Please contact the Holy Family Church office!

The month of October is dedicated to Our Lady of the Holy Rosary. Beginning 20 minutes before all Latin Masses, we'll recite the Most Holy Rosary.

Many thanks to HF and SGO volunteers as I assure you of my profound gratitude for your service of Our Lord as I offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass especially for you on a regular basis.

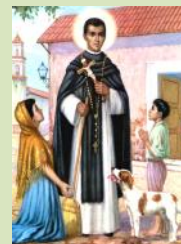

Dedication of St. Michael the Archangel

INTROIT: *Ps. 102:20* Bless the Lord all ye His angels: you that are mighty in strength, and execute His word, hearkening to the voice of His orders. (*Ps*) Bless the Lord, O my soul: and let all that is within me bless His holy name. Glory be. Bless the Lord...

COLLECT: O God, Who in a wonderful order hast established the ministry of angels and of men, mercifully grant that even as Thy holy angels ever do Thee service in heaven, so at all times they may defend us on earth. Through our Lord...

COLLECT of the 16th Sunday after Pentecost: May Thy grace, we beseech Thee, O Lord, ever go before us and follow us: and make us continually to be intent upon good works. Through our Lord...

EPISTLE: *Apoc. 1: 1-5* In those days: God signified the things which must shortly come to pass, sending by His Angel to His servant John, who hath given testimony to the word of God, and the testimony of Jesus Christ, what things soever he hath seen. Blessed is he that readeth and heareth the words of this prophecy, and keepeth those things which are written in it; for the time is at hand. John to the seven churches which are in Asia: Grace be unto you and peace from Him that is, and that was, and that is to come; and from the seven spirits which are before His throne; and from Jesus Christ, Who is the faithful Witness, the First Begotten of the dead, and the Prince of the kings of the earth, Who hath loved us, and washed us from our sins in His own blood.

GRADUAL: *Ps. 102: 20, 1* Bless the Lord, all ye His angels: you that are mighty in strength, who execute His word. Bless the Lord, O my soul, and let all that is within me bless His holy name.

ALLELUIA: Alleluia, alleluia. Holy Archangel Michael, defend us in battle: that we may not perish in the dreadful judgment. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *Mt. 18: 1-10* At that time, the disciples came to Jesus, saying, Who, thinkest Thou, is greater in the kingdom of heaven? And Jesus calling unto Him a little child, set him in the midst of them, and said: Amen I say to you, unless you be converted, and become as little children, you shall not enter into the kingdom of heaven. Whosoever therefore shall humble himself as this little child, he is the greater in the kingdom of heaven: and he that shall receive one such little child in My name, receiveth Me; but he that shall scandalize one of these little ones that believe in Me, it were better for him that a millstone should be hanged about his neck, and that he should be drowned in the depth of the sea. Woe to the world because of scandals: for it must needs be that scandals come; but nevertheless woe to that man by whom the scandal cometh. And if thy hand or thy foot scandalize thee, cut it off, and cast it from thee. It is better for thee to go into life maimed or lame, than having two hands or two feet, to be cast into everlasting fire. And if thy eye scandalize thee, pluck it out and cast it from

thee. It is better for thee having one eye to enter into life, than having two eyes to be cast into hell fire. See that you despise not one of these little ones; for I say to you, that their Angels in heaven always see the face of My Father Who is in heaven.

OFFERTORY: *Apoc. 8: 3, 4* An Angel stood near the altar of the temple, having a golden censer in his hand: and there was given to him much incense: and the smoke of the perfumes ascended before God, alleluia.

SECRET: We offer unto Thee, O Lord, the sacrifice of praise, and humbly beseech Thee that, through the prayers of the Angels who plead for us, Thou wouldst both graciously accept it, and grant that it may avail us unto salvation. Through our Lord...

SECRET of the 16th Sunday after Pentecost: Cleanse us, we beseech Thee, O Lord, by the virtue of the present sacrifice, and, in Thy mercy, provide that we may be worthy to be partakers therein. Through our Lord.

COMMUNION: *Dan. 3: 58* All ye Angels of the Lord, bless the Lord: sing a hymn, and exalt Him above all forever.

POSTCOMMUNION: Supported by the intercession of blessed Michael, Thine Archangel, we humbly beseech Thee, O Lord, that the service we pay with our lips, we may lay hold of with our minds. Through our Lord.

POSTCOMMUNION of the 16th Sunday after Pentecost: In Thy goodness, we beseech Thee, O Lord, purify and renew our minds by these heavenly Sacraments: that by means of them, we may also receive help for our bodies, both now and in time to come. Through our Lord.

GOSPEL of the 16th Sunday after Pentecost: *Lk. 14: 1-11* At that time, when Jesus went into the house of one of the chief of the Pharisees on the sabbath day to eat bread, they watched Him. And behold, there was a certain man before Him that had the dropsy: and Jesus answering, spoke to the lawyers and Pharisees, saying: Is it lawful to heal on the sabbath day? But they held their peace: but He taking him, healed him, and sent him away. And answering them, He said: Which of you shall have an ass or an ox fall into a pit, and will not immediately draw him out on the sabbath day? And they could not answer Him these things. And He spoke a parable also to them that were invited, marking how they chose the first seats at the table, saying to them: When thou art invited to a wedding, sit not down in the first place, lest perhaps one more honorable than thou be invited by him; and he that invited thee and him, come and say to thee: Give this man place: and then thou begin with shame to take the lowest place. But when thou art invited, go, sit down in the lowest place: that when he who invited thee cometh, he may say to thee: Friend, go up higher. Then shalt thou have glory before them that sit at table with thee: because every one that exalteth himself shall be humbled; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.

Feast of St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face

INTROIT: *Cant. 4: 8-9* Come from Libanus, my spouse, come from Libanus, come; thou hast wounded my heart, my sister, my spouse, thou hast wounded my heart. *Ps. 112: 1* Praise the Lord, ye children: praise ye the name of the Lord. Glory be... Come ...

COLLECT: O Lord, Who hast said: Unless you become as little children you shall not enter into the Kingdom of heaven: grant unto us, beseech Thee, so to follow in humility and simplicity of heart the footsteps of Saint Therese, the Virgin, that we may obtain everlasting rewards: Who livest and reignest...

EPISTLE: *Is. 66: 12-14* Thus saith the Lord: Behold I will bring upon her as it were a river of peace, and as an overflowing torrent the glory of the Gentiles which you shall suck; you shall be carried at the breasts, and at the knees they shall caress you. As one whom his mother caresseth, so will I comfort you: and you shall be comforted in Jerusalem. You shall see and your heart shall rejoice, and your bones shall flourish like an herb, and the hand of the Lord shall be known to his servants.

GRADUAL: *Mt. 11: 25; Ps. 70: 5* I confess to Thee, O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because Thou hast hid these things from the wise and prudent and hast revealed them to little ones. My hope, O Lord, from my youth.

ALLELUIA: *Ecclus. 39: 17-19* Alleluia, alleluia. Bud forth as the rose planted by the brooks of waters: Give ye a sweet odor as frankincense. Send forth flowers as the lily, and yield a smell, and bring forth leaves in grace, and praise with canticles and bless the Lord in his works. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *Mt. 18: 1-4* At that time, the disciples came to Jesus, saying: Who, thinkest Thou, is the greater in the kingdom of heaven? and Jesus

calling unto Him a little child, set him in the midst of them, and said: Amen I say to you, unless you be converted and become as little children, you shall not enter into the kingdom of heaven. Whosoever therefore shall humble himself as this little child, he is the greater in the kingdom of heaven.

OFFERTORY: *Lk. 1: 46-48, 49* My soul doth magnify the Lord: and my spirit hath rejoiced in God my Savior: because He hath regarded the humility of His handmaid. He that is mighty hath done great things to me.

SECRET: May the holy prayers of Saint Therese Thy Virgin, we beseech Thee, commend our sacrifice to Thee, O Lord: in her honor we solemnly offer it: in view then of her merits do Thou accept it. Through our Lord...

COMMUNION: *Deut. 32: 10-12* He led her about and taught her, and He kept her as the apple of His eye. As an eagle He has spread His wings and hath taken her on His shoulder. The Lord alone was her leader.

POSTCOMMUNION: May the heavenly mystery, O Lord, inflame us with the fire of that love by which Saint Therese, Thy Virgin, offered herself to Thee as a victim of charity for mankind. Through our Lord...
