Keeping the True Catholic Faith by St. Vincent de Lerins (†434)

"Now in the Catholic Church itself we take the greatest care to hold that which has been believed everywhere, always and by all. That is truly and properly Catholic, as is

shown by the very force and meaning of the word, which comprehends everything almost universally. We shall hold to this rule if we follow universality, antiquity, and consent by all. 1) We shall follow universality if we acknowledge that one Faith to be true which the whole Church throughout the world confesses; 2) antiquity if we in no wise depart from those interpretations which it is clear that our ancestors and fathers proclaimed; 3) and consent, if in antiquity itself, we keep following the definitions and opinions of all, or certainly nearly all, Bishops and Doctors alike.But what if some novel contagions try to infect the whole Church, and not merely a tiny part of it? Then he will take care to cleave to antiquity, which cannot now be led astray by any deceit of novelty.... And whatever he shall find to have been held, approved and taught, not by one or two only but by all equally and with one consent, openly, frequently, and persistently, let him take this as to be held by him without the slightest hesitation."

What is the November 4-8 Priestly Convocation?

The Convocation aims to foster the family spirit of the Institute among the canons serving in the United States by providing spiritual, cultural, and fraternal experiences for their mutual enrichment, recreation, and edification. In June we canons attend an Annual Spiritual Retreat preached by Monsignor Gilles Wach, Founder and Prior General of the Institute of Christ the King, and in August we attend the Annual Chapter meeting in Italy for a week of prayer and conferences. The Convocation is a more relaxed atmosphere for the canons, to enable many of them to visit a "new apostolate", and for the faithful to get a chance to meet their past and future pastors. Each day, each priest will say his private Mass in church (11 at the same time!), then enjoy a breakfast with the other canons, and then the priests visit the sites of Tucson. They arrive Monday night and will leave by Friday.


This is only the 2nd Convocation that the Institute has held in the American Province, so it is a tremendous privilege for us to welcome them to OUR HOME. We still need YOUR HELP to make our church and grounds look the best to thank Monsignor Wach for graciously sending us priests to staff this church for over 11 years! Without the Institute priests, we wouldn't have the Sacraments so easily accessible every single day.

As the Convocation is first for the priests, the only significant chance to meet, greet, and speak with them will be on Wednesday evening, November 6th. Monsignor Wach will celebrate and preach a Solemn High Mass at 6PM. Then all the faithful of both Holy Family and Saint Gianna are invited to our Institute Family Dinner at Dunbar Auditiorium with Monsignor Wach, Canon Talarico, the American Provincial Superior, and the other 23 canons serving the US. Please RSVP asap to guarantee your seat with a canon and your place at table. The food will be catered or prepared by our food team. The evening will conclude with entertainment by a nine-person Mariachi band, our very own Folklorico dancers, and songs by the choir. Entrance to dinner will be free though donations will be greatly appreciated to help offset costs for both Saint Gianna Oratory and the Institute apostolates.

Eighteenth Sunday after Pentecost

INTROIT: *Ecclus*. *36*: *18* Give peace, O Lord, to them that patiently wait for Thee, that Thy prophets may be found faithful: hear the prayers of Thy servant, and of Thy people Israel. *Ps. 121*: *1* I rejoiced at the things that were said to me: we shall go into the house of the Lord. Glory be. Give peace, O Lord...

COLLECT: Let the exercise of Thy compassion, we beseech Thee, O Lord, direct our hearts: for without Thee we are not able to please Thee. Through our Lord...

EPISTLE: I Cor. 1: 4-8 Brethren, I give thanks to my God always for you, for the grace of God that is given you in Jesus Christ, that in all things you are made rich in Him in all utterance and in all knowledge, as the testimony of Christ was confirmed in you; so that nothing is wanting to you in any grace, waiting for the manifestation of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Who also will confirm you unto the end without crime, in the day of the coming of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

GRADUAL: Ps. 121: 1, 7 I rejoiced at the things that were said to me: We shall go into the house of our Lord. Let peace be in thy strength, and abundance in thy towers.

ALLELUIA: Ps. 101: 16 Alleluia, alleluia. The Gentiles shall fear Thy name, O Lord: and all the kings of the earth Thy glory. Alleluia.


GOSPEL: Mt. 9: 1-8 At that time, Jesus entering into a boat, passed over the water and came into His own city. And behold they brought Him one sick of the palsy lying in a bed; and Jesus seeing their faith, said to the man sick of the palsy: Be of good heart, son, thy sins are forgiven thee. And behold some of the scribes said within themselves: He blasphemeth. And Jesus seeing their thoughts, said: Why do you think evil in your hearts? whether is easier to say: Thy sins are forgiven thee, or to say: Arise and walk? But that you may know that the Son of man hath power on earth to forgive sins (then said He to the man sick of the palsy): Arise, take up thy bed, and go into thy house. And he arose, and went into his house. And the multitude seeing it feared and glorified God Who had given such power to men.

OFFERTORY: Ex. 24: 4, 5 Moses consecrated an altar to the Lord, offering upon it holocausts, and sacrificing victims: he made an evening sacrifice to the Lord God for an odor of sweetness, in the sight of the children of Israel.

SECRET: O God, Who, by Thy venerable intercourse with us in this Sacrifice dost make us partakers of the one Supreme Godhead: grant, we beseech Thee, that as we know Thy truth, so we may follow it by worthy lives. Through our Lord...

COMMUNION: Ps. 95: 8-9 Bring up sacrifices, and come into His courts: adore ye the Lord in His holy court.

POSTCOMMUNION: We have been renewed, O Lord, by Thy sacred Gift, and thank Thee, beseeching Thee in Thy mercy to make us worthy partakers in It. Through our Lord...



Prayer to Saint Joseph

This Prayer to the Patron of the Universal Church was prescribed by His Holiness Pope Leo XIII to be recited after the daily Rosary during October, month of the Holy Rosary.

To thee, O blessed Joseph, we have recourse in our affliction, and having implored the help of

thy thrice holy Spouse, we now, with hearts filled with confidence, earnestly beg thee also to take us under thy protection. By that charity wherewith thou wert united to the Immaculate Virgin Mother of God, and by that fatherly love with which thou didst cherish the Child Jesus, we beseech thee and we humbly pray that thou wilt look down with gracious eye upon that inheritance which Jesus Christ purchased by His blood, and wilt succor us in our need by thy power and strength.

Defend, O most watchful guardian of the Holy Family, the chosen off-spring of Jesus Christ. Keep from us, O most loving Father, all blight of error and corruption. Aid us from on high, most valiant defender, in this conflict with the powers of darkness. And even as of old thou didst rescue the Child Jesus from the peril of His life, so now defend God's Holy Church from the snares of the enemy and from all adversity. Shield us ever under thy patronage, that, following thine example and strengthened by thy help, we may live a holy life, die a happy death, and attain to everlasting bliss in Heaven. Amen.
