Because of our limited capacity and our small church, it is necessary to SIGN-UP to attend Masses.

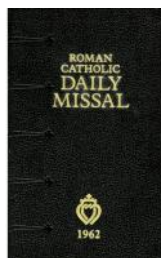
For English Mass @ Holy Family please call the parish office (520)623-6773 to reserve a Mass time.

For Latin Mass @ St. Gianna, you must sign-up for the Mass you will attend by a *Signup Genius* link that you'll be emailed or call the Oratory office (520)883-4360 if you don't have email.

SIGN-UP preference is given to Registered Members.

Registration forms are at the back of the church.

- The bishop has made masks mandatory on church grounds and social-distancing of 6 feet is required.
- *The obligation of attending Mass is still suspended though Sundays and holy days must remain days of prayer and rest.*
- If you or a family member with whom you have regular contact is sick, **please stay home**. If you're over 65 or have an underlying condition compromising your health, you may consider staying home.
- Please refrain from congregating in the church or outside before and after Mass. Please keep 6 ft. Social Distancing at all times on church property.
- Let us continue to pray the Litany of St. Joseph everyday for our bishop, for our diocese, and for a good resolution soon to the restrictions due to the virus.
- Let us also pray that our world turns from sin. As people of faith, we see this as a divine "wake-up call" to conversion and penance for the many sins committed against Our Lord, the Blessed Sacrament, His Mother, and the Church.

O GOD, Who in the Heart of Thy Son, wounded by our sins, dost mercifully bestow on us infinite treasures of love: grant, we beseech Thee, that whilst we render It the devout homage of our affection, we may also fulfill our duty of worthy satisfaction. Through the same our Lord.

First Saturday, Sept 5th

*Collect from the Votive Mass of
**The Immaculate Heart of the
Blessed Virgin Mary***

Almighty everlasting God, Who in the heart of the blessed Virgin Mary didst prepare a dwelling worthy of the Holy Ghost: grant in Thy mercy, that we who with devout minds celebrate the festival of that immaculate heart, may be able to live according to Thine own Heart. Through our Lord...in the unity of the same Holy Ghost.



Prayer to Blessed Mother Mary

When I feel myself tossed about in the sea of this world amidst storms and tempests, I keep my eyes fixed on thee, O Mary, shining star, lest I be swallowed up by the waves.

When the winds of temptations arise, when I dash against the reefs of tribulations, I raise my eyes to thee and call upon thee, O Mary. When I am agitated by the billows of pride, ambition, slander or jealousy, I look to thee and invoke thee, O Mary; when anger or avarice or the seductions of the flesh rock the fragile little barque of my soul, I always look to thee, O Mary. And if I am troubled by the enormity of my sins, troubled in conscience, frightened at the severity of judgment, and if I should feel myself engulfed in sadness or drawn into the abyss of despair, again I raise my eyes to thee, always calling on thee, O Mary.

In dangers, in difficulties, in doubts, I will always think of thee, O Mary, I will always call on thee. May thy name, O Virgin Mary, be always on my lips and never leave my heart; in order that I may obtain the help of thy prayers, grant that I may never lose sight of the example of thy life. Following thee, O Mary, I shall not go astray, thinking of thee I shall not err; if thou dost support me I shall not fall; if thou dost protect me I shall have nothing to fear; if thou dost accompany me I shall not grow weary; if thou lookest upon me with favor, I shall reach the port. Thirteenth Sunday after Pentecost

INTROIT: *Ps. 73: 20, 19, 23, 1* Have regard, O Lord, to thy covenant, and forsake not to the end the souls of Thy poor: arise, O Lord, and judge Thy cause, and forget not the voices of them that seek Thee. (Ps) O God, why hast Thou cast us off unto the end: why is Thy wrath enkindled against the sheep of Thy pasture. Glory be. Have regard...

COLLECT: Almighty and everlasting God, give to us an increase of Faith, Hope, and Charity: and that we may deserve to obtain what Thou dost promise, make us love what Thou dost command. Through our Lord...

EPISTLE: *Gal. 3: 16-22* Brethren: To Abraham were the promises made, and to his seed. He saith not: And to his seeds, as of many; but as of one: And to thy seed, which is Christ. Now this I say, that the testament which was confirmed by God, the law which was made after four hundred and thirty years, doth not disannul, to make the promise of no effect. For if the inheritance be of the law, it is no more of promise. But God gave it to Abraham by promise. Why then was the law? It was set because of transgressions until the seed should come, to whom He made the promise, being ordained by angels in the hand of a mediator. Now a mediator is not of one, but God is one. Was the law then against the promises of God? God forbid. For if there had been a law given, which could give life, verily justice should have been by the law. But the Scripture hath concluded all under sin, that the promise by the faith of Jesus Christ might be given to them that believe.

GRADUAL: *Ps. 73: 20, 19, 22* Have regard, O Lord, to thy covenant, and forsake not to the end the souls of Thy poor. Arise, O Lord, and judge Thy cause: remember the reproach of Thy servants.

ALLELUIA: *Ps. 89: 1* Alleluia, alleluia. Lord, Thou hast been our refuge, from generation to generation. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: *Lk. 17: 11-19* At that time, as Jesus was going to Jerusalem, He passed through the midst of Samaria and Galilee: and as He entered into a certain town, there met Him ten men that were lepers, who stood afar off, and lifted up their voice, saying: Jesus, Master, have mercy on us. Whom when He saw, He said: Go, show yourselves to the priests. And it came to pass, that, as they went, they were made clean. And one of them, when he saw that he was made clean, went back, with a loud voice glorifying God: and he fell on his face before His feet, giving thanks: and this was a Samaritan. And Jesus answering said: Were not ten made clean? And where are the nine? There is no one found to return and give glory to God, but this stranger. And He said to him: Arise, go thy way; for thy faith hath made thee whole.

OFFERTORY: *Ps. 30: 15, 16* In Thee, O Lord, have I hoped: I said, Thou art my God, my times are in Thy hands.

SECRET: Look, graciously, O Lord, upon Thy people: graciously look upon our gifts: and, appeased by this offering, mayest Thou grant us pardon and give us what we ask. Through our Lord...

COMMUNION: *Wis. 16: 20* Thou hast given us, O Lord, bread from heaven, having in it all that is delicious, and the sweetness of every taste.

POSTCOMMUNION: We who have received the heavenly Sacraments beseech Thee, O Lord, that we may steadily advance towards eternal redemption. Through our Lord...
