## From the Rector's Desk:

My Dear Faithful,

Beginning this Monday on the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, Sept. 14th, and leading up to the traditional Feast of Christ the King (EF), October 25th, all of the Apostolates of the Institute of Christ the King will be performing a **40 days of Prayer for America Prayer Campaign**.



1) Here we will have a daily Holy Hour in front of the Blessed Sacrament, with the Rosary and devotions recited. This is a very important time both in the Church and in our Nation. Our Church is greatly suffering from a lack of clear doctrinal, pastoral, and moral teaching from the top-down, with ex-Catholics being the 2<sup>nd</sup> greatest “denomination” in America. This is also a crucial time in our nation as the most pro-life president in history (as we are, of course, praying for his full conversion) is up for re-election against the most pro-abortion and most radically anti-God candidates ever. It is our duty out of charity for God and for our family and neighbors that in this crucial time that we increase our prayers to Almighty God for His Divine help. At a minimum, I’m asking every family to be saying the Rosary together, not just individually. “Together” because the Rosary is more powerful together : “Where 2 or 3 are gathered together in my name, there am I in their midst”Mt 18:20. As public worship is greater than private devotions, the more public our prayer is the more God is glorified. The Saints greatly recommend the Rosary. Bl. Pope Pius IX said: “Give me one million families praying the Rosary and the world is saved” and “If you desire peace in your hearts, in your homes, in your country, assemble every evening to recite the Rosary.” The theme of the family rosary was also carried by Pope St. Pius X: “Give me an army saying the Rosary and I will conquer the world.” St. Louis Marie de Montfort said in his *Secrets of the Rosary*: “One who says his Rosary alone only gains the merit of that one Rosary. But if he says it together with others, he gains the merit of each Rosary. This is the law of public prayer.” During these 40 days, I’m also encouraging all fathers to remember their duty as heads of the household - as God established fathers to be the head of the household, by this divine appointment, that they need to lead their family in prayer. Fathers are the public head of the household and this entails them to also lead the family in the Rosary and in the religious duties of each member.

2) Secondly, to witness publicly our opposition to the murder of innocent babies in abortion, we will have a volunteer group praying in front of the Tucson Planned Parenthood facility each day for God’s Mercy - so that these abortion facilities may be shut down and prayers for all mother’s considering abortion. Sign-up sheets will be in the back of church to write down the day/s on which you will pray in front of this abortion facility and offer your prayerful support of mothers to bring their child to term. Sign-ups are intended to help cover each day. Please obey the law and stay on the public sidewalk.

These 40 days of Prayer for America are not only that our country be more pro-life but that it be pro-eternal life. It’s great if we can stop abortion and win the election of the president the most favorable to the Church’s Moral Teachings, but we still haven’t saved the soul until they receive the Sacraments. For this I’m asking all faithful to participate in these prayerful activities as much as you are able. I think most can participate in at least a few Holy Hours and a few visits to pray in front of the Abortion clinics. May Christ the King reign deeply in all hearts in the USA!

3. Pray the St. Michael Prayer.

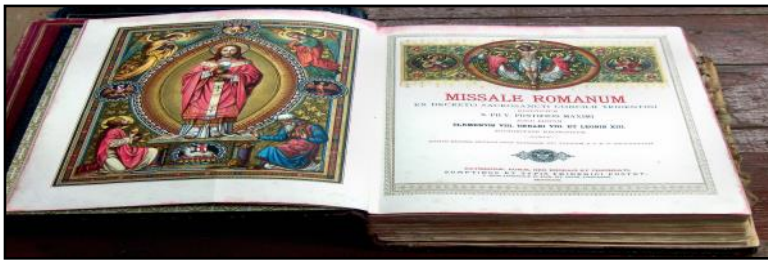

## **St. Louis Marie de Montfort on the Holy Rosary:**

- 1) "It is through the most Blessed Virgin Mary that Jesus Christ came into the world, and it is also through her that he will reign in the world."
- 2) "Our entire perfection consists in being conformed, united and consecrated to Jesus Christ. Hence the most perfect of all devotions is undoubtedly that which conforms, unites and consecrates us most perfectly to Jesus Christ. Now, since Mary is of all creatures the one most conformed to Jesus Christ, it follows that among all devotions that which most consecrates and conforms a soul to our Lord is devotion to Mary, his Holy Mother, and that the more a soul is consecrated to her the more will it be consecrated to Jesus Christ."
- 3) "It would hardly be possible for me to put into words how much Our Lady thinks of the Holy Rosary and of how she vastly prefers it to all other devotions. Neither can I sufficiently express how highly she rewards those who work to preach the devotion, to establish it and spread it, nor on the other hand how firmly she punishes those who work against it."

## *Fifteenth Sunday after Pentecost*

**INTROIT:** *Ps. 85: 1,2,3,4* Incline Thine ear, O Lord, to me and hear me: save Thy servant, O my God, that trusteth in Thee: have mercy on me, O Lord, for I have cried to Thee all the day. (*Ps*) Give joy to the soul of Thy servant; for to Thee, O Lord, I have lifted up my soul. Glory be. Incline Thine ear, O Lord.....

**COLLECT:** Let Thy continual pity, O Lord, cleanse and defend Thy Church: and because it cannot continue in safety without Thee, may it ever be governed by Thy goodness. Through our Lord...

**EPISTLE:** *Gal. 5: 25,26; 6: 1-10* Brethren: If we live in the spirit, let us also walk in the spirit. Let us not be made desirous of vainglory, provoking one another, envying one another. Brethren, and if a man be overtaken in any fault, you, who are spiritual, instruct such a one in the spirit of meekness, considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted. Bear ye one another's burdens, and so you shall fulfill the law of Christ. For if any man think himself to be something, whereas he is nothing, he deceiveth himself. But let everyone prove his own work, and so he shall have glory in himself only, and not in another. For every one shall bear his own burden. And let him that is instructed in the word, communicate to him that instructeth him, in all good things. Be not deceived, God is not mocked; for what things a man shall sow, those also shall he reap. For he that soweth in his flesh, of the flesh also shall reap corruption: but he that soweth in the spirit, of the spirit shall reap life everlasting. And in doing good, let us not fail; for in due time we shall reap, not failing. Therefore, whilst we have time, let us work good to all men, but especially to those who are of the household of the faith.

And when He came nigh to the gate of the city, behold a dead man was carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow, and a great multitude of the city was with her. Whom when the Lord had seen, being moved with mercy towards her, He said to her: Weep not. And He came near and touched the bier. And they that carried it stood still. And He said: Young man, I say to thee, arise. And he that was dead sat up, and began to speak. And He gave him to his mother. And there came a fear on them all: and they glorified God, saying: A great prophet is risen up amongst us, and God hath visited His people.
