General Remarks On Indulgences

From the Office of the Apostolic Penitentiary

An indulgence is defined in the Code of Canon Law (can. 992) and in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (n. 1471) as “a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints.”

In general, the gaining of indulgences requires certain prescribed conditions, and the performance of certain prescribed works.

To gain indulgences, whether plenary or partial, it is necessary that the faithful be in the state of grace at least at the time the indulgenced work is completed.

A plenary indulgence can be gained only once a day. In order to obtain it, the faithful must, in addition to being in the state of grace:

- have the interior disposition of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin;
- have sacramentally confessed their sins;
- receive Holy Communion;
- pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff.

It is appropriate, but not necessary, that the sacramental Confession and especially Holy Communion and the prayer for the Pope’s intentions take place on the same day that the indulgenced work is performed; but it is sufficient that these sacred rites and prayers be carried out within several days (about 20)

before or after the indulgenced act. One sacramental Confession suffices for several plenary indulgences, but a separate Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the Holy Father’s intentions are required for each plenary indulgence. Prayer for the Pope’s intentions is left to the choice of the faithful, but an “Our Father” and a “Hail Mary” are suggested. The Pope’s intentions are four in number : 1. The progress of the Faith and triumph of the Church; 2. Peace and union among Christian Princes and Rulers; 3. The conversion of sinners; 4. The uprooting of heresy. Indulgences can always be applied either to oneself or to the souls of the deceased, but they cannot be applied to other persons still living.

During the month of November, dedicated to the Holy Souls in Purgatory, moved by charity for their succor, let us strive to gain as many indulgences as possible for their deliverance from their sins to soon share in the joys of Heaven!

*The Apostolic Penitentiary announced (on Oct 22) modifications to the
PLENARY INDULGENCES FOR THE SOULS IN PURGATORY:*

- (1) A plenary indulgence applicable only to the souls in purgatory is granted the faithful who on Nov. 2nd, devoutly visit a church or an oratory and recite an Our Father and the Creed, but this year is extended to any day in November each member of the faithful chooses to do the work of the indulgence (with the usual requirements).
- (2) A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory is granted each and every day from Nov 1 to Nov 8, those faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and there pray, if only mentally, for the departed, but this year is extended to anyone who visits a cemetery, even mentally, on any day in November (with the usual requirements).

Twenty-Third Sunday after Pentecost

INTROIT: Jer. 29: 11, 12, 14; Ps. 84: 2 The Lord saith: I think thoughts of peace, and not of affliction: you shall call upon Me, and I will hear you; and I will bring back your captivity from all

places. (Ps) Lord, thou hast blessed Thy land: Thou hast turned away the captivity of Jacob. Glory be. The Lord saith: I think...

COLLECT: O Lord, we beseech Thee, absolve Thy people from their offenses, that through Thy bountiful goodness, we may be freed from the bonds of those sins, which by frailty we have committed. Through Our Lord.

EPISTLE: Phil. 3: 17-21; 4: 1-3 *A reading from the Letter of Blessed Paul the Apostle to the Philippians*

Brethren: Be ye followers of me, and observe them who walk so as you have our model. For many walk, of whom I have told you often (and now tell you weeping), that they are enemies of the cross of Christ; whose end is destruction, whose God is their belly, and whose glory is in their shame; who mind earthly things. But our conversation is in heaven, from whence also we look for the Savior, our Lord Jesus Christ, Who will reform the body of our lowliness, made like to the body of His glory, according to the operation whereby also He is able to subdue all things unto Himself. Therefore, my brethren, dearly beloved, and most desired, my joy and my crown: so stand fast in the Lord, my dearly beloved. I beg of Evodia, and I beseech Syntyche, to be of one mind in the Lord: and I entreat thee also, my sincere companion, help those women who have labored with me in the Gospel, with Clement and the rest of my fellow laborers, whose names are in the book of life.

GRADUAL: Ps. 43: 8-9 Thou hast saved us, O Lord, from them that afflict us: and hast put them to shame that hate us. In God we will glory all the day long: and in Thy name we will give praise for ever.

ALLELUIA: Ps. 129: 1-2 Alleluia, alleluia. Out of the depths I have cried to Thee, O Lord: Lord, hear my voice. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Mt. 9: 18-26 *+Continuation of the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew*

At that time, as Jesus was speaking to the multitudes, behold a certain ruler came up, and adored Him, saying: Lord, my daughter is even now dead; but come lay Thy hand upon her, and she shall live. And Jesus, rising up, followed him, with His disciples. And behold a woman, who was troubled with an issue of blood twelve years, came behind Him and touched the hem of His garment. For she said within herself: If I shall touch only His garment, I shall be healed. But Jesus turning and seeing her, said: Be of good heart, daughter thy faith hath made thee whole. And the woman was made whole from that hour. And when Jesus was come into the house of the ruler, and saw the minstrels and the multitude making a tumult, He said: Give place; for the girl is not dead, but sleepeth.
