From the Rector's Desk:

Dear Faithful,

Yesterday at the Divine Office of *None* we closed the Liturgical Year. Today we begin this new Liturgical Year with Sunday Mass. Tomorrow (Nov. 30th) we begin our Preparatory Novena to the Immaculate Conception. Repetition is the key to good education and Holy Mother Church centers our Liturgical Calendar around the most important mysteries of our Catholic Faith: **Christmas, Epiphany, Easter, and Pentecost.** As Mary is the **new Eve**, the true mother of the living, we begin each Liturgical Year of Grace with a celebration of Mary, as the Immaculate Mother of Christ and the Mother of Grace in our soul.

In Advent, we not only prepare for Christmas but also for His 2nd Coming! If we want to have a blessed Christmas, today is the time to start our spiritual preparation. And, if we want to be on Our Lord's right hand at His second Coming, today is the time to start our spiritual preparation. **That is why, as the Institute of Christ the King Sovereign Priest is consecrated to Our Lady under the title of Her Immaculate Conception, we solemnize this most important feast of Our Lady by a preparatory novena from Nov. 30th - Dec. 7th.** Our Lady's Immaculate Conception was the very first victory of Christ's grace. Even before He came in the flesh, He applied His Salvific Grace, that He would win for humanity on Good Friday, beforehand in preserving Mary from Original Sin. Why Mary? She was chosen to be the Mother of God because of Her humility. Therefore, we ought to strive to follow Her in Her humility, so that we can be protected and strengthened by His Grace for the second Coming. As Mary prepares us for Christmas, She prepares us for His Second Coming as well! We are sinners and we need to do penance for our sins and beg Our Lord for His Mercy.

So join us for the Preparatory Novena! Following Holy Mass, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed and we'll recite the Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, recite Her Litany, recite the *Novena Prayer*, sing the *Tota Pulchra Es* hymn followed by Eucharistic Benediction. If you cannot join us each day, then join us in prayer by the public and communal family Rosary and Novena prayers led by the head of the household!

1st Sunday of Advent

INTROIT: (*Ps. 24. 1-3; Ibid. 4*) To Thee, O Lord, have I lifted up my soul: in Thee, O my God, I put my trust; let me not be ashamed. Neither let my enemies laugh at me: for none of them that wait on Thee shall be confounded. *Ps.* Show, O Lord, Thy ways to me, and teach me Thy paths. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

COLLECT: Arise in Thy strength, we beseech Thee, O Lord, and come: from the dangers which threaten us because of our sins, be Thy presence our sure defense, be Thy deliverance our safety for evermore. Who livest and reignest, with God the Father, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end. Amen.

EPISTLE: (*Rom 13. 11-14*) A reading from the Epistle of the blessed apostle Paul to the Romans. Brethren, knowing the time, that it is now the hour for us to rise from sleep; for now our salvation is nearer than when we believed. The night is past, and the day is at hand; let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and put on the armour of light. Let us walk honestly, as in the day; not in rioting and drunkenness, not in chambering and impurities, not in contention and envy; but put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ.

GRADUAL: (*Ps. 24. 3, 4*) None of them that wait on Thee shall be confounded. Show, O Lord, Thy ways to me, and teach me Thy paths.

ALLELUIA: (*Ps. 84. 8*) Alleluia, alleluia. Show us O Lord, Thy mercy: and grant us Thy salvation. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: (*Luke 21. 25-33*) Continuation of

the Holy Gospel according to Saint Luke. At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: "There shall be signs in the sun, and in the moon, and in the stars; and upon the earth distress of nations, by reason of the confusion of the roaring of the sea and of the waves: men withering away for fear and expectation of what shall come upon the whole world. For the powers of heaven shall be moved; and then they shall see the Son of man coming in a cloud with great power and majesty. But when these things begin to come to pass, look up and lift up your heads, because your redemption is at hand." And He spoke to them a similitude: "See the fig tree, and all the trees; when they now shoot forth their fruit, you know that summer is nigh; so you also, when you shall see these things come to pass, know that the kingdom of God is at hand. Amen I say to you, this generation shall not pass away till all things be fulfilled. Heaven and earth shall pass away, but My words shall not pass away."

OFFERTORY: (*Ps. 24. 1-3*) To Thee have I lifted up my soul: in Thee, O my God, I put my trust, let me not be ashamed: neither let my enemies laugh at me: for none of them that wait for Thee shall be confounded.

SECRET: May, O Lord, these Sacred Rites enable us, whom by Thy mighty power Thou hast cleansed from sin, to come pure in heart before Thee who art their author. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end. Amen.

COMMUNION: (*Ps. 84. 13*) The Lord will give goodness: and our earth shall yield her fruit.

POSTCOMMUNION: May we in the midst of Thy holy temple, O Lord, receive of Thy mercy, who seek with fitting honour to welcome the coming festival of our Redemption. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Thy Son, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end. Amen.
