Week of Prayer for an End to Schism

Ad tollendum schisma

Jan. 18 - Jan. 25

Beginning on the feast of the Chair of St. Peter at Rome, Jan. 18, we pray until the feast of the Conversion of St. Paul on Jan. 25 for the return to the fullness of the Catholic Church those separated brethren currently outside the Church of Christ. This is in particular a great time to pray for fallen away family members! During these dates, there will be a Collect, Secret, and Post-Communion added to each Mass for this intention replacing the prayer for the Pope (pro Papa).

Prayers at Mass

Collect: O God, who setteth straight what has gone astray, and gatherest together what is scattered, and keepest what Thou has gathered together: we beseech Thee in Thy mercy to pour down on Christian people that grace of union with Thee, that putting disunion aside and joining themselves to the true Shepherd of Thy Church, they may be able to render Thee worthy service. Through our Lord Jesus Christ...

Secret: Sanctify, O Lord, for the union of Christian people, these gifts offered to Thee; and by their means grant us the grace of union and peace within Thy Church. Through our Lord...

Post-Communion: We beseech Thee, O Lord, that this Thy holy communion which we have received, as it represents the union of the faithful in Thee, so may it bring about reunion in Thy Church. Through our Lord...

The following prayers are to be recited daily as requested by Pope Benedict XV in His Brief *Romanum Pontificum* of 1916:

ANTIPHON: That they all may be one, as Thou, Father, in Me and I in Thee; that they also may be one in Us; that the world may believe that Thou hast sent Me.

V. I say unto thee, thou art Peter;

R. And upon this rock I will build my Church.

Here is brought to mind the intention for the day's prayer:

Jan 18: For the return of the "other sheep" to the One Fold of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Jan 19: For the return of the Eastern Orthodox Christians to communion with the Apostolic See.

Jan 20: For the return of the Anglicans to the authority of the Vicar of Christ.

Jan 21: For the return of all Protestants throughout the world to the unity of the Catholic Church.

Jan 22: That Christians in America may be one, in union with the Chair of Saint Peter.

Jan 23: That lapsed Catholics will return to the Sacraments of the Church.

Jan 24: That the Jewish people will be converted to the Catholic Faith.

Jan 25: That missionary zeal will conquer the world for Christ.

Let us pray. O Lord Jesus Christ, who said unto Thine Apostles: Peace I leave you, My peace I give to you; regard not our sins, but the faith of Thy Church, and grant unto her that peace and unity which are agreeable to Thy Will; Who livest and reignest ever, one God, world without end. Amen.

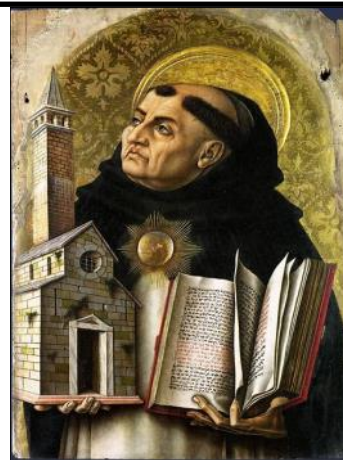
attain that degree of glory which God in His mercy holds out to me. Obtain also that particular favor for which I now pray (*mention intention*)

Spiritual Wisdom from St. Francis de Sales

Considered in themselves, tribulations certainly cannot be loved, but considered in their origin, namely in the Providence of the Divine Will which has brought them about, they are to be loved with an infinite love. Just consider Moses' staff: laid on the ground, it was a ferocious serpent; in the hands of Moses it was a wonder-working wand. In like manner, tribulations in themselves are terrible, but considered as a manifestation of the will of God they are indications of love and delight. Likewise, love either removes the harshness of the trial or renders it lovable.

Second Sunday after Epiphany

INTROIT: Ps. 65: 4,1,2 Let all the earth adore Thee, O God, and sing to Thee; let it sing a psalm to Thy name, O Most High. (Ps) Shout with joy to God, all the earth, sing ye a psalm to His Name; give glory to His praise. Glory be... Let all...

COLLECT: O Almighty and everlasting God, Who dost govern all things both in heaven and on earth: mercifully hear the prayers of Thy people, grant us Thy peace in our time. Through Our Lord.

EPISTLE: Rom. 12: 6-16

Brethren: Having different gifts, according to the grace that is given us: either, to be used according to the rule of faith; or ministry, in ministering; or he that teacheth, in doctrine; he that exhorteth in exhorting; he that giveth, with simplicity; he that ruleth, with carefulness; he that showeth mercy, with cheerfulness. Let love be without dissimulation. Hating that which is evil, cleaving to that which is good: loving one another with the charity of brotherhood, with honor preventing one another: in carefulness not slothful; in spirit fervent: serving the Lord: rejoicing in hope: patient in tribulation: instant in prayer: communicating to the necessities of the Saints: pursuing hospitality. Bless them that persecute you: bless, and curse not. Rejoice with them that rejoice, weep with them that weep: being of one mind one towards another: not minding high things, but consenting to the humble.

GRADUAL: Ps. 106: 20,21 The Lord sent His word, and healed them: and delivered them from their destruction. Let the mercies of the Lord give glory to Him: and His wonderful works to the children of men.

ALLELUIA. Alleluia, alleluia. Praise ye the Lord, all His Angels praise ye Him, all His hosts. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: John 2: 1-11

At that time there was a marriage in Cana of Galilee: and the Mother of Jesus was there. And Jesus also was invited, and His disciples, to the marriage. And the wine failing, the Mother of Jesus saith to Him: They have no wine. And Jesus saith to her: Woman, what is that to Me and to thee? My hour is not yet come. His Mother saith to the waiters: Whatsoever He shall say to you, do ye. Now there were set there six water-pots of stone, according to the manner of the purifying of the Jews, containing two or three measures apiece. Jesus saith to them: Fill the water-pots with water. And they filled them up to the brim. And Jesus said to them: Draw out now, and carry to the chief steward of the feast. And they carried it. And when the chief steward had tasted the water made wine, and knew not whence it was, but the waiters knew who had drawn the water: the chief steward calleth the bridegroom, and saith to him: Every man at first setteth forth good wine, and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse: but thou hast kept the good wine until now. This beginning of miracles did Jesus in Cana of Galilee: and manifested His glory, and His disciples believed in Him.

OFFERTORY: Ps. 65: 1,2,16 Shout with joy to God, all the earth: sing ye a psalm to His name: come and hear, all ye that fear God, and I will tell you what great things the Lord hath done for my soul, alleluia.

SECRET: Hallow, O Lord, these our oblations: and cleanse us from the stains of our sins. Through Our Lord.

COMMUNION: Jn. 2: 7,8,9,10-11 The Lord saith: Fill the water-pots with water, and carry to the chief steward. When the chief steward had tasted the water made wine, he saith to the bridegroom: Thou hast kept the good wine until now. This first miracle did Jesus in the presence of His disciples.

POSTCOMMUNION: May the working of Thy power, we beseech Thee, O Lord, be increased in us: that, quickened by the divine Sacraments, we may be prepared by Thy grace to obtain what they promise. Through Our Lord.
